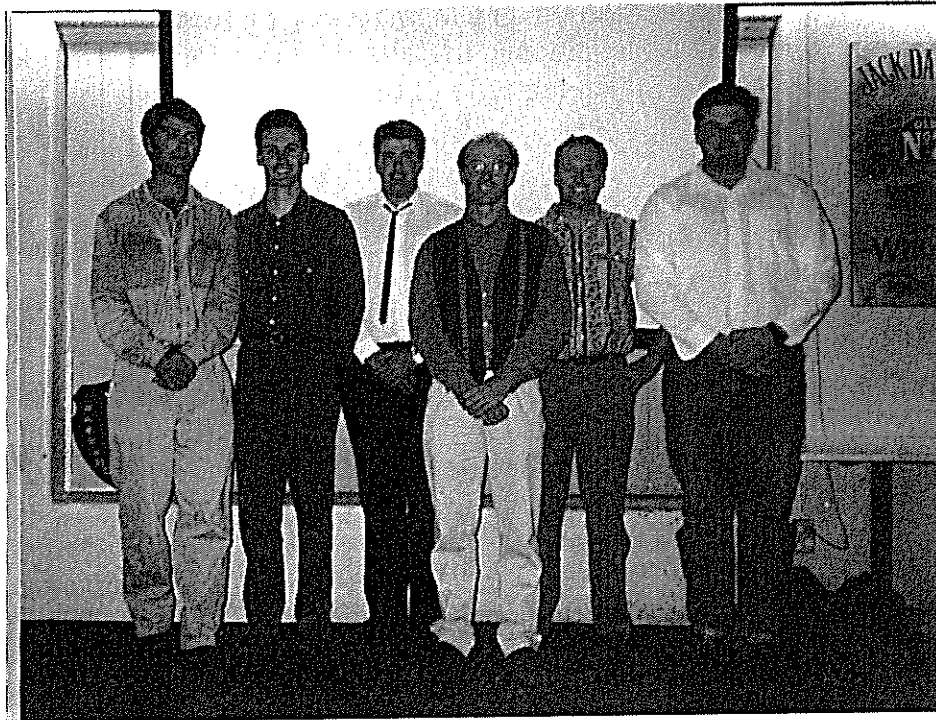
To all captains and selectors who's work is never easy, especially when it comes to crunch time at finals, thank you all.

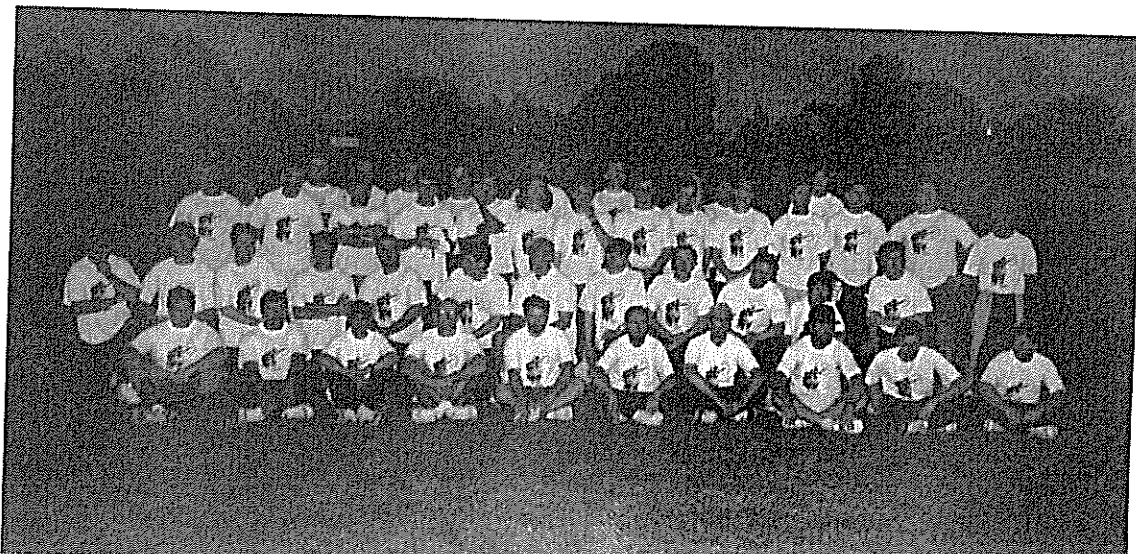

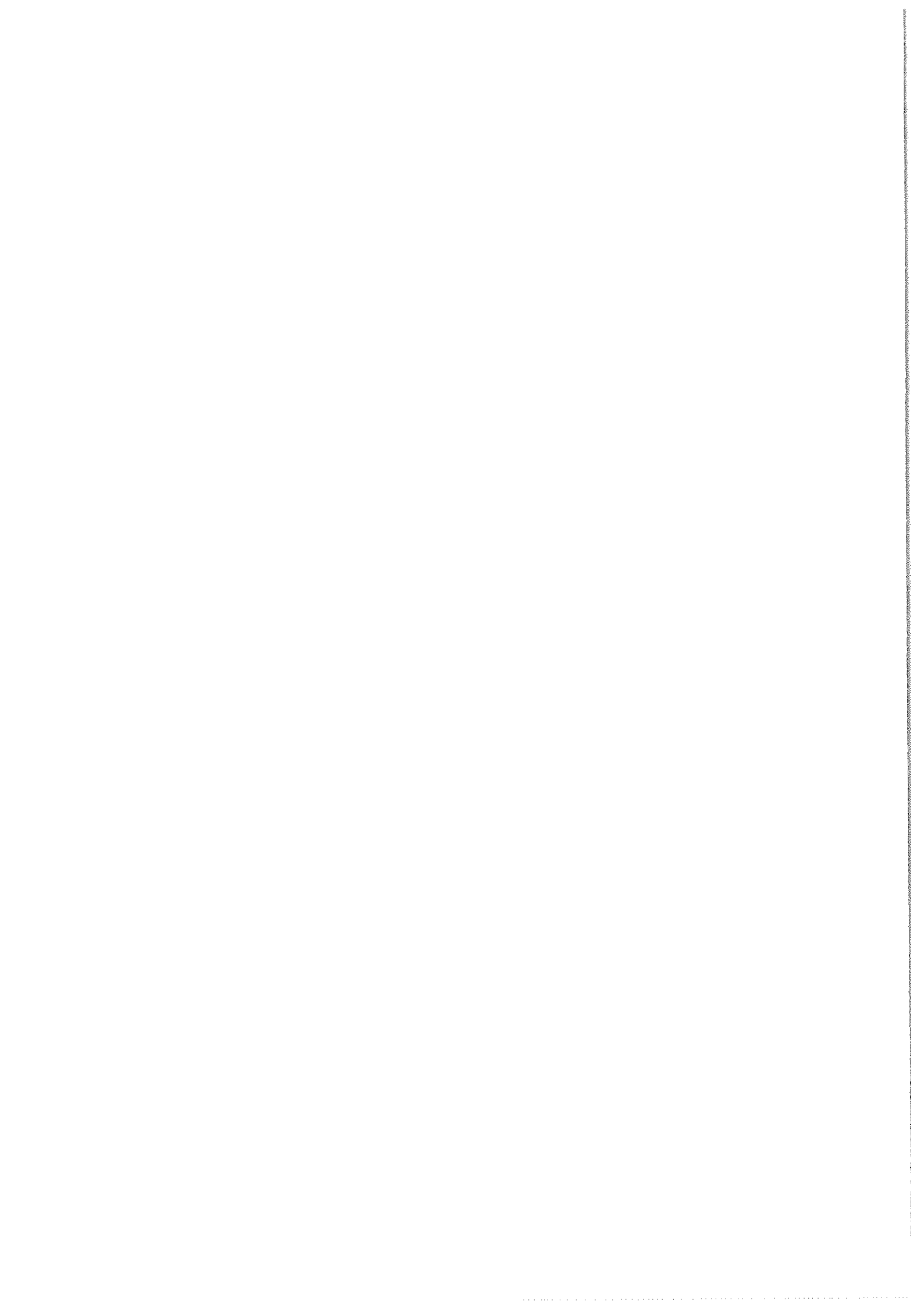

LIFE MEMBERSHIPS

VAL STEENHOLDT

The Applecross Cricket Club has been around 19 seasons with next season being the 20th anniversary of the club. Over these 19 seasons if one was asked to associate a name with the Applecross Cricket Club it would be Val Steenholdt.

No other member of the club both playing and non playing is more known throughout the Association than Val. Every player that has played with or against Val, I have no doubt still remembers the experience.

Over the history of the club times have changed and the club has experienced many highs and lows both on the field and off. Throughout those times it has been Val who has been the steady influence who has taken on the responsibility to get things done and the club back on an even keel.

Val has played over 160 games for Applecross the highest of any player of the club and in that time has amassed over 2,000 runs and over 300 wickets. It is a further compliment to Vals ability that last year he was the fairest and best cricketer in the 2nd eleven and this year won the Bowling Aggregate in the 2nd eleven. Unfortunately Val has not had the experience of playing in a Premiership side though he has played in and captained sides in many finals with the club.

Val has been instrumental in the clubs rise into first grade cricket. He has shared his vision with the various committees who have worked for many years to achieve the clubs place as a strong A grade club and a senior club within the Association. Val has played a large part in enticing many senior players to the club no more evident than the recruitment of Peter Spencer in 1986, English cricketer John Wright in 1988 and Mike Broadbridge in 1993.

Many years ago Val introduced the now infamous "Club" trip involving players spending the Australia Day long weekend in some unfortunate country town. Towns like Pingelly, Collie, Brookton, Fairbridge, etc have never quite recovered from these invasions, the legacy of Club trips organised by Val.

One cannot speak of the efforts of Val Steenholdt without acknowledging the enormous support and individual effort made by his wife Lorraine. Lorraine's effort in running the kitchen on Thursdays and Saturdays plus the afternoon teas during the game are much appreciated by the players and it was pleasing to see that Lorraine's efforts were recognised by the members by voting her and Val as joint Best Clubman together with Lorraine being awarded the Presidents Trophy.

It is with great pleasure that the club recognises the efforts of Val Steenholdt by awarding him Life Membership of the Applecross Cricket Club.

As the Club moves towards its 20th season, we can look back on a proud record - 5 premierships, a number of grade wins, several other grade finals, the list goes on. We can also boast excellent Club facilities and a sound financial position. Such a record hasn't come easily and to a large extent is thanks to the hard work, commitment and loyalty of special club members like Steve Melville, who was presented with the Club's greatest honour, Life Membership, at our end of season wind-up.

Steve joined the Club 1979/80 at the age of 19 and has gone on to represent the Club in no less than 135 games. He has scored many runs and taken many wickets and I can well recall a seven wicket haul by Steve in a 2nd grade match in 1987/88.

He has filled the position of official Auditor for the past three years and is responsible for the production of the Club Yearbook. In addition, Steve has given invaluable assistance and advice to incoming treasurers.

In the 15 years we have been involved with the Club Steve and I have formed a firm friendship and it was a great honour to make the presenting speech at the wind-up. Congratulations "Bear", our 6th Life Member.

A special word of thanks to Burt Baetsen who as Vice Captain was a constant source of support, advice and enthusiasm.

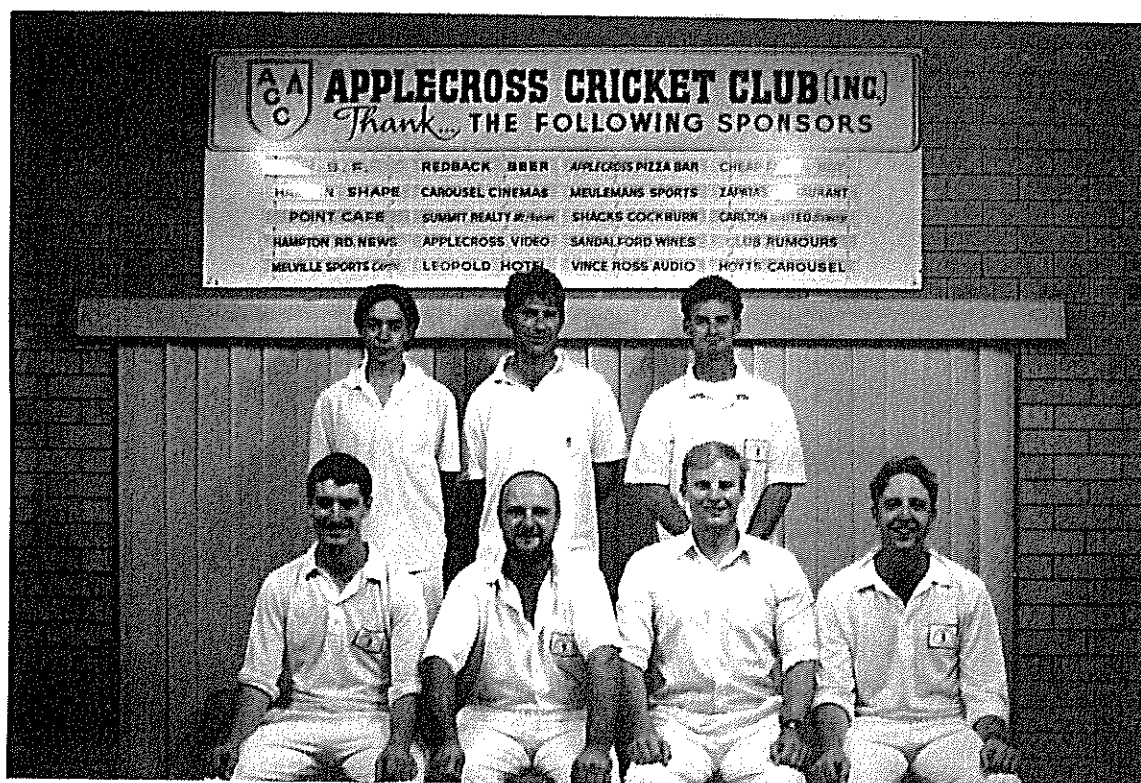

IMPRESSIONS ON RETURN - GEORGE PRINCE

After being a member of the Applecross Cricket Club since 1979, I felt the time was right for a break at the end of the 1990/91 season. However it didn't take long to get the itch back and I certainly enjoyed my return to the game last season, and the Year Book editor thought it would be interesting to read of my impressions of the Club after the break.

The first thing I noticed was the feeling of being a "newcomer" to the Club, despite having been a member for so long. The Club's on and off field success has certainly created a strong reputation around the traps and has attracted plenty of talented cricketers through the grades. I certainly noticed a lot of new faces and the social atmosphere definitely benefited. I have never known the Club to be a strong socially as it is now. The Club is a fun place to be after training and on Saturday nights, particularly for families (which hasn't always been the case).

The Club's off field leadership is very strong and we are fortunate to have such a committed and hard working President. Russell received good support from his committee, however the rest of the Club must be careful not to take his efforts for granted. The Club's future financial well being is every member's responsibility.

The attendance at training is terrific and the hardworking attitude of the Club's bowlers in particular is excellent. However, I have noticed some negative aspects about training and in my opinion these have had a detrimental effect on our on field performances. Before I go on I must say that Val does a great job of running net practice, it's a full time job. Unfortunately, net training is so busy that the value of batting at training has diminished. The time available is limited and is usually pretty torrid in at least two nets due to the strong competition amongst the Club's large contingent of fast bowlers.

Added to this is the neglectful attitude towards field practice. I believe fielding accounts for 50% of the game, however at training last season we afforded it about 5% at best. Responsibility in this area rests with the respective captains. There's no use in complaining about poor fielding performances on Saturdays if you don't put in the work at training.

Perhaps a solution to these problems would be to operate only three nets at training, leaving one net free for throw downs for players wanting more concentrated work on their batting, or for keeping practice. The players freed up by having one less net could then concentrate on fielding, perhaps on a grade by grade basis, under the guidance of the appointed fielding practice coordinator. I am aware the Club executive is considering the provision of such a position next season.

I can well remember the premiership teams of 1981/82, 1986/87 and 1987/88 devoting whole sessions to fielding on a regular basis and in some cases even putting in extra training sessions solely for fielding practice. The benefits of this hard work were obvious.

I hope these comments are seen to be constructive. I must say I looked forward to training more than in the past and we must be doing something right - 1 premiership, 3 grand finals and the promise of more to come if we build on the strong foundations laid over the past three seasons. One final comment. Let's all get behind the top side next season in their quest to make the first grade finals for the first time in the Club's History. They are the Club's flagship and deserve our support. Let's give plenty!

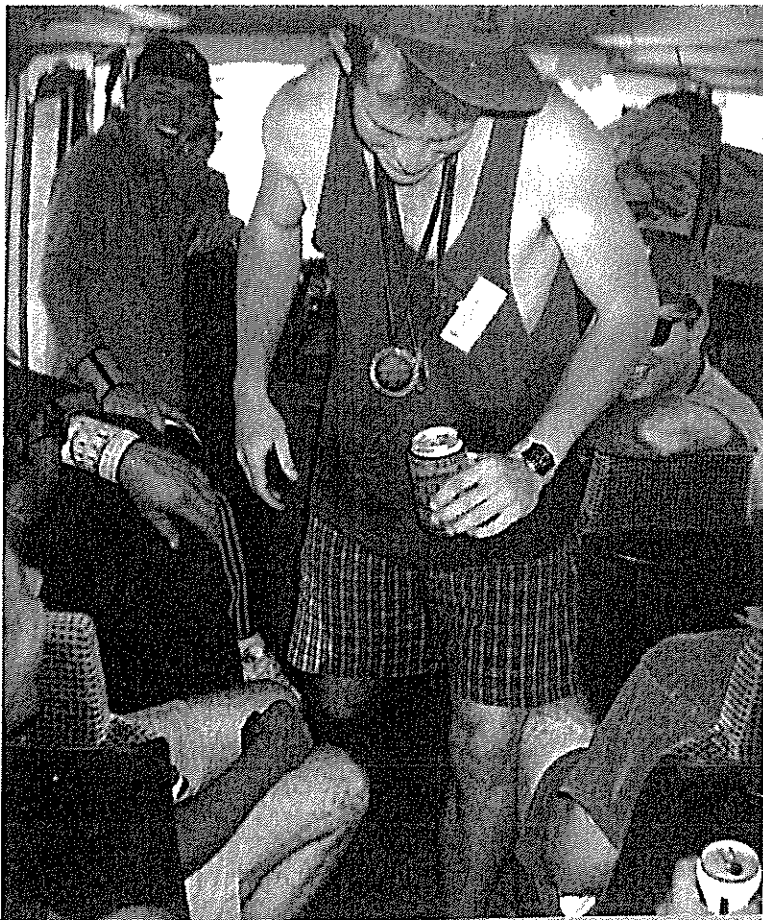
