

President's Report:

Russell Kingdon

Well the 1994/95 cricket season curtain has fallen on a very successful season for the Applecross Cricket Club.

For the first time in its short history the Club has played off in the First Grade finals, also in the year of the Club's 20th birthday. All the sides finished in the top six. Three of our sides missed out on finals due to only one thing, inconsistency with the cricket bat.

Most of the Club played in a higher grade this year after last year having our 7th, 8th and 9th grade sides promoted to the next grade.

This year was the hardest year financially in my term as president. Due to the Applecross Football Club folding and changes within the Club the Club must find a extra \$4,000 per year just to break even. To raise this money the Club can do two things; organise additional fundraising events (which no one likes to get involved with) or increase the annual subscriptions. From a business and management point of view the later is the correct way for the Club to enter the 1995/96 season.

For the Club to operate each year it takes a lot of work from a lot of dedicated people. Firstly I would like to thank Lorraine for her efforts feeding the army of hungry stomachs, all captains who gave a commitment to a stepping stone year, thank you all. To Stuart Rankin, Brian Bilton and Val Steenholdt for coordinating and controlling training. Its never easy especially on selection weeks, when you have 60 people training. To my committee some major decisions were made this year. Looking back we got it 80% correct though there is room for improvement. Special thanks to Rob Pulley, Steve Doble and Angus Castley, three first year committee members.

To our Club sponsors, thank you all very much, without your support the Club would struggle.

At the start of the year the Club sent out a letter to all members stating a number of things, the new coach Stuart Rankin, the new A grade captain Brian Bilton, when pre season started and to give all members the opportunity to get down to pre season early to make your impression on the new captain and coach. Because of the new leadership it gave all members a fantastic opportunity. Brad Favas took his opportunity, he went from the 4th eleven to the 1st eleven and taking his career best 33 wickets in a season. It's amazing what a good preseason can do, we should take a leaf out of his book. Well done Brad!

Next season will be a challenge. As a Club we must recruit 10 more players from all avenues to ensure the Club is strong for the future.

I look forward to seeing you all at pre season in early August 1995. Have a safe and Red/Black winter.





Four Centuries on One Day

It has been my privilege this season to lead the Applecross 1st XI, in what is now in the records as it's most successful season - making the 1st Grade finals for the first time.

During the pre-season there was much talk of the number of players which had left the Club and the need to recruit new players to bolster the strength of the 1st XI. As it transpired there was no influx of new players and so the strength had to be found within the Club.

As a newcomer, performance on the training track were seen by me in terms only of ability or potential and were not tainted by last's years grades or reputations. This meant I was lucky enough to have a 1st XI training squad of around 50 players. The resulting announcement of the team to play the first fixture raised a few eyebrows as many former 2nd XI players and the odd 7th or 8th grader were given their chance. It is probably fair to say that while the Club held high hopes for it's 1st XI, after seeing the team on paper, few really believed it would be a good year. The team were keen to prove them wrong.

After an easy win in round 1, the side was soon put to the test against South Perth in round 2. The guys passed the test with flying colours in a see-sawing match, as we gained as unlikely tie from the last ball. Coming back from 6 for 98 to reach 9 for 286 gave the side what it had lacked previously - self confidence and the belief that they were capable of fighting out of any situation. With this new weapon in the Applecross armoury the following close games became wins instead of losses and as the season progressed the team went into every game knowing that they not only could, but should win. The regular season ended as it began with a century from Mike Kapiteyn to ensure a place in the finals.

The team which played Whitfords in round 11 in may ways bore little resemblance to the side which played in round 1. The names had changed very little but the players now formed a team which had a hunger for success and a belief they could achieve it. I have no hesitation in saying that at that point we were the best team in the competition. The only thing that this team now lacked was final's experience. This weighed against us in the final but I feel the side still played exceptionally well, outplaying the opposition for 3 of the 4 sessions and in all facets apart from the brittle batting display. This along with a fair share of bad luck on a number of fronts cost us the match and probably a deserved flag.

Applecross Cricket Club can take great pride in itself for it's performance this year and take heart in the fact that the predominantly home grown and very young 1st XI matured and learnt much in a few short games.

The season resulted not only on the Club's first 1st grade finals appearance but the transition of several players into 1st grade players of real quality. The experience gained from a hard fought final will be invaluable in our efforts to go that one step further next year. As too will that sinking feeling of defeat on the hill at Nedlands, and the desire to never feel that way again.

On a personal note, to all who played under me, many thanks for your superb efforts. You have all gained my respect as I'm sure you have from the rest of the Club. Special thanks to the more senior players for your assistance on the field - it always helps to have many pairs of eyes and lots of ideas when captaining. Thanks also to the entire Club for your support throughout the season, I only hope I can repay you with a flag next year.



The season started with everyone having high expectations after reaching the grand final the previous season. The first half of the season proved to be mediocre with a few close matches being lost and a few outright opportunities missed. This could be explained by the fact that the composition of side was quite unstable due to the personal commitments of several players in the top three sides. I don't think any more than 5 players would have been in the side for all of the matches leading up to Christmas.

After Christmas was a different story. Even though there were no stars, the team played well together and won every game in the new year. This was a terrific performance for a team in its first season in 6th grade. And we were very unfortunate not making it into the finals - eventually finishing in a creditable 6th place. Shane Berzinski was a great find as the into the wind outswing bowler and took 6/67 against South Perth (Big Russ taking three catches). Against Whitfords in the last game of the season he scored 118 in a Club and Association record partnership of 238 with myself. His innings included moving from 39 to 100 in 13 scoring shots - an awesome display. I was happy to finish the season with a century (129) in that same game against Whitfords.



Congratulations to Des Carruthers with an extremely consistent batting season with not one score below 10 and an average in excess of 30. Des's wicket keeping was also very consistent with 23 catches and 2 stumpings for the season. Stu Rankin's 22 wickets from 5 games and Ryan Greenwell's improved batting where other highlights.

Rob Mulroney proved that he can be 'once again' a match winner for the Club providing he puts in a hard pre season. Mark Anderson showed he is a very talented batsman who will improve his run scoring threefold when he learns not to give his wicket away.

I think the disappointing aspect from this year was that the Club does not have the depth that it would like. All bowlers in the Club have to learn the discipline of bowling at the stumps on a good length. This can only come from a more disciplined and thorough approach at training. A large number of the lower grade batsmen did not appear to have improved over the last two seasons and the Club has a responsibility, by coaching these players to improve their game.



After a great 5 to 1 win loss record in the first half of the season our side faulted badly in the second half to lose three games and only win two hence us finishing fifth on the ladder. We finished on a high though, scoring our second 200+ score for the season in the last game, the type of score we needed more often. It is disappointing to say that after great bowling and fielding efforts by the entire team, our batsmen failed with the tail being the only resistance.

Tyrone Murphy was the only player to score well with one century, an aggregate of 382, and an average of 34.72. No other player scored over 200 runs for the season although Richard Campbell did well as keeper/batsman scoring 179 from 9 games, Dale Tribbeck performed well as our second keeper.

Mid season we conceded two outright losses to teams below us on the ladder. It was this and 4 scores below 100 for the season that cost us the points necessary to appear in the finals. We realised all to late that in 72 over cricket we must bat with more responsibility to build an innings and consolidate after losing early wickets. All players are to be commended for their fielding and on-ground conduct during the season, as are those who attended training regularly.

Unfortunately I am leaving Perth to move to Sydney and don't know if or when I'll be back, such a shame as I enjoy the Club so much and believe it will work hard to match elsewhere. Best of luck to eighth grade and all at Applecross Cricket Club in 1995/96.

I believe that there are several players including Brendon Tribbeck, Justin Vance and Scott Thompson that certainly have the ability to play further up the grades which can only benefit the Club next season. Personally I'd like to thank all those that have made my time at Applecross most rewarding and enjoyable and I look forward to playing again next season.


