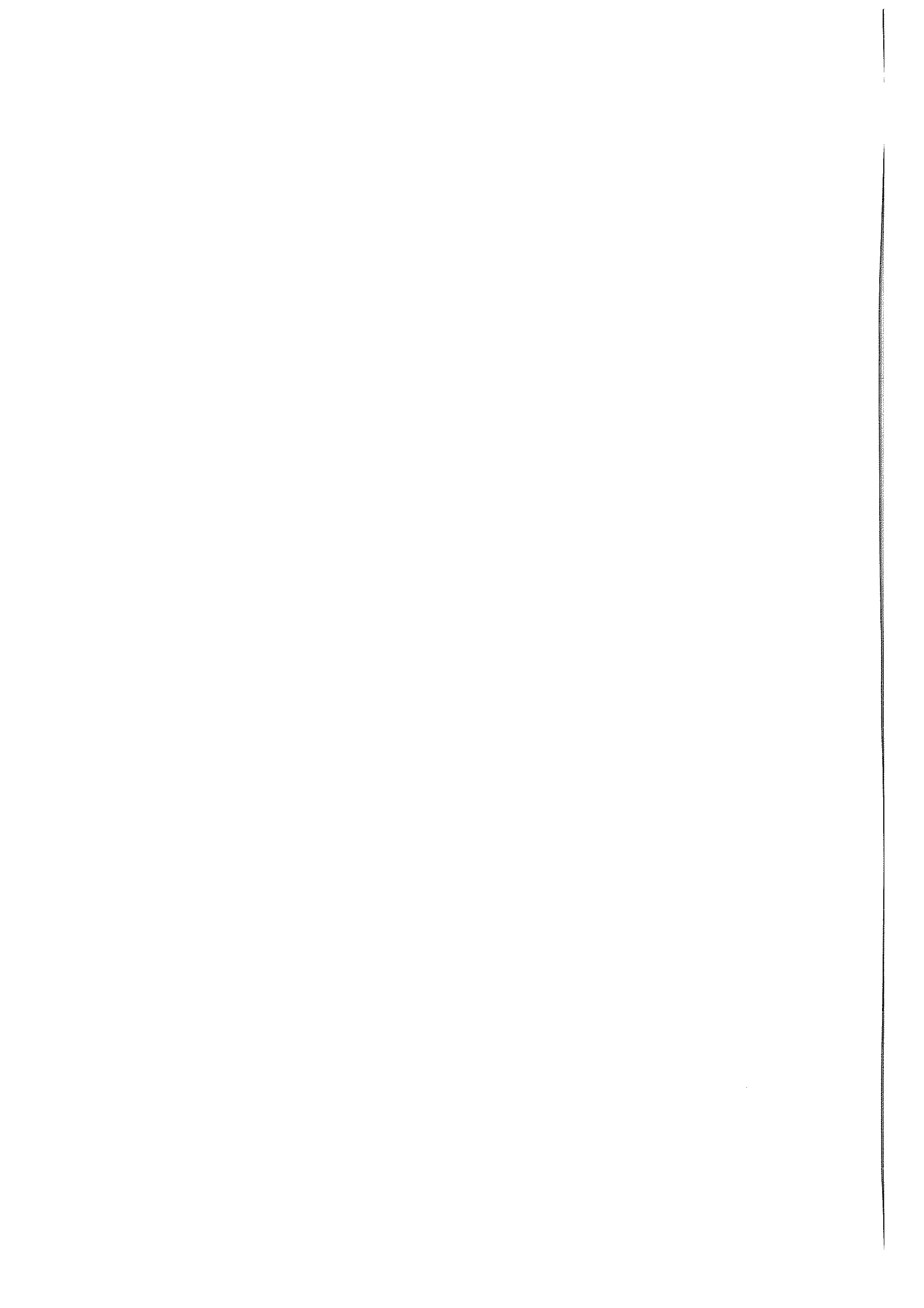

Never having written a President's report before, I sought inspiration from the previous year's report and was struck by the prophetic words "next season will not be easy". I went into the year with a basic understanding of the requirements of the position and as if to cloud the issue further took as my colleagues into season 96/97 a new Vice President in Angus Castley, a new secretary in Brad Favas and two new general committee members in Glenn Wright and Brett MacGregor. We spent the best part of the pre season in extraordinary committee meetings trying to choose a new Coach and 1st Grade Captain which we finally did about three weeks before the start of the season. Still not seeing the challenge ahead, we thought that for the remaining five grades we should choose new captains inexperienced in the art of captaincy. With the benefit of hindsight, this was always going to be a tough year.

The hardest decision for the committee this year was forfeiting the ninth grade competition, especially as some of the club "stalwarts" have made a home in this grade and as the last premiership won by the club was in this grade. The numbers however were not good and we could not justify continuing in this grade.

What made the year most difficult for all was the lack of numbers. We lost a lot of key players early and a number of players ended up playing in grades that they would not have played in had we had a full squad to choose from. I suppose this is good in terms of experience, but when the players who had missed the early part of the season returned, the damage had already been done and teams which at that stage should have been entrenched in the finals were scrapping for fourth place and as it turned out, the season finished two weeks earlier than we had hoped.

The season was also marred by a number of incidents which I will not mention individually but were unbecoming of a group of individuals who rely on mateship and team play for success at our sport. If we are to be successful as a club, we need to be able to rely on and trust our team mates to be playing on the same team.

Despite all this and no teams in the finals, the season finished well. We had so many players back in the latter half of the season that teams looked unbeatable and if we can enter season 97/98 with as many players, we may well be unbeatable. The Royce Spencer led raffle ensured that we will enter the next season in the black and if Bob Meuleman is right, the upcoming Ashes tour may well tease more than a few sets of whites out of mothballs and bodies to pre-season training.

Thanks must go to the committee who I will not name individually but will thank in particular Matt Halliday for his efforts in balancing the books which must have seemed impossible in January. Thanks to all the captains who all did fine jobs in their first year and the Coach Stef Perer who may have done things differently had he had his time again

but unfortunately did not have the numbers at training to implement many of the initiatives he had planned. Thanks also to the tireless Steenholdt family without whom many young men would have gone home starving.

In parting, I will mention three highlights which will stand in my mind as reminders of this season.

- The 1st grade outright against High Wycombe - made even more notable by the fact that it was done with Baetsen fielding on one day;
- Val Steenholdt's 200th game - the first player ever to do so for the club;
- The commitment of \$1,500 to the turf wicket fund by Coca Cola. It may not be much but it is a start and a positive sign of progress.

All in all the season will be looked upon in shadow as we spent the two weekends of the finals, not playing cricket. The signs are positive however for season 97/98 and despite Kapo and Weiry moving on to greener pastures - pastures which we all hope will be very green (but not too much grass), I look forward to the upcoming season and the success that it promises.

I have enjoyed my first year as President, I thank those who had the faith to elect me as an unknown quantity and hope the club feels I have done enough to appoint me for another year as I feel I am starting to get the hang of it.

The loss of Brian Bilton, the man who had lead us into successive first grade finals, was certainly off set before the commencement of the season by the recruitment of John McGuire as first grade captain. John brought with him a wealth of experience as a leading aboriginal sporting identity, a premiership footballer with East Perth and most importantly, the all time leading run scorer in WACA first grade history.

Certainly our confidence for the season ahead was vindicated in the season opener, when John scored a chanceless 114 not out as we passed eventual finalist Balcatta's 231 with 7 balls to spare and five wickets in hand. However, from that moment the season become somewhat of a roller coaster ride, particularly for the batsmen, as solid performances were followed by inexplicable collapsed, such as:

dismissed for 109 chasing Bassendean's 133, Mike Kapiteyn opening and being last man out for 47.

dismissed for 128 versus MNOB, the last 4 wickets falling for 7 runs.

losing 8/48 to be defeated by Swanbourne.

dismissed for 103 by Wembley Downs in a crucial round 10 clash.

With 5 wins and a draw after round 9 we were in the top 4, but crushing losses to Wembley Downs and Whitfords in the final 2 rounds resulted in a sixth place finish only 5.98 points out of a finals berth.

There is no doubt that our batting let us down at crucial times. John McGuire's 432 run aggregate and 39.27 average put him in the Association top 10, but was a disappointing return for a player of his calibre. Michael Kapiteyn was a consistent as ever with 351 runs, while Greg Oldfield toiled for 239 runs. Stefan Perer's 289 runs was a huge drop in form for a player who had totalled 1,202 runs in the previous 2 seasons, but no doubt his own coaching commitments had an impact on his performance.

The bowling figures were dominated by veteran Rob Pulley (36 wickets at 13.61 average) and Brad Weir (34 wickets at 13.41 average). Rob took more wickets than any other bowler in the grade and he and Brad finished in 4th and 3rd positions respectively in the Association averages. Brad's best figures were 5/16 in the first innings of an incredible outright victory over High Wycombe, Rob's match figures for the same game were an outstanding 8/31. The ever reliable Brad Favas provided great support throughout the season with 20 wickets.

Special mentions should also be made of Damian O'Hara's all round performance (batting average 24.71 and 25 catches) and Stefan Perer's 110 against Victoria Park, his fourth century for the club.

Applecross 3rd grade experienced a solid year highlighted by some very good team and individual performances and unfortunately three costly narrow defeats.

The first half of the season saw us three wins from six games at Christmas, however all players held the belief that this was not a true indication of our team's ability. As a team we lifted after Christmas to win the next three games peaking with our outright demolition of Victoria Park.

With two games to go a finals berth was at our finger tips however luck deserted us and close loses in the final two games saw us slip from the four (missing the finals by about 32 runs, 0.32 points).

Individual performances of note include Grant Newport 106, Matt Halliday 102 and 73, Peter Jordan 101 no, Simon Shalders, 68, 60 and 79, Paul Broadbridge 52. With the ball Richard Mulrone 5/32, Brett McGregor 5/40, Troy Cawthorn 5/40, Val Steenholdt 5/89 and 5/32, Paul Broadbridge 5/27, Al Field 8/12, Duncan Collie 4/10. Overall as a captain it was extremely pleasing to have the support of all the players and my job was made easier knowing that the 11 guys each week were giving their best.

Although we missed the finals it was interesting to note that three of our players finished in the Association's leaders. In the bowling Val Steenholdt was runner up with 25 wickets @ 12.56. In the batting Simon Shalders 294 runs @ 42.00 was runner up and Matt Halliday with 255 @ 36.43.

Highlight of the 96/97 season would have to be our annihilation of Victoria Park knocking them over for 80 in their first innings (Collie 4/10, Broadbridge 5/27) then declaring at 1/194 (Jordan 101 no, Stirling 48) to send them in and roll them for 33 in their second innings(byes and leg byes top scoring with 8). Al Field an awesome performance of 15 overs 7 maidens, 8 for 12 with 5 of those being bowled. At the time of playing Victoria Park they were about 6th on the ladder and pressing for a finals berth, we put paid to that. !!!

Many thanks to all 3rd grade players throughout the season and good luck for 97/98.

At the beginning of the season it was thought that the 5th Grade could make the finals. The fluctuations of fortune saw us to within 0.2 points of a finals berth. Having advanced from 6th Grade the previous season, it was good to avoid relegation early in the season and establish ourselves in the competition as a competitive team.

After 4 wins from 4 games we were going along fine. We didn't win the next four games placing us in 6th position. In the middle stages of the season, the reduced squad of players may have affected our performances but win a minimal change in luck and three of four losses could have been wins. During the season we had victories over three of the four teams that finished above us. The two teams who played in the grand final we defeated in our last two games of the season. A couple of our mid-season losses against lower sides were very costly considering that if we had been in the finals a premiership flag was a real possibility.

Notable performances were more with the ball than with the bat. It was our bowlers in most games who provided our competitive edge. Nick Ashbrook (7 games) was a real stalwart who genuinely frightened opposition batsman, Brian Seymour (5 games) definitely rattled a few cages when he crosses the 'white line', Glen Warber (6 games) usually very accurate and can bowl the occasional unplayable ball, Jason Markwart (10 games), was used in a variety of roles in the attack and loves taking a wicket, and Neil Watt (10 games), most of the time watching opposition batsmen trying to pick the floaters is good entertainment, 'if you get the drift'. The above mentioned were our mainstay bowlers. Some other fine performances were contributed by other bowlers who played less games.

Our batting was good in five games but otherwise was a little inconsistent. Nigel Brown (4 games) and Matt Halliday (4 games) were the standout batsmen in 5th grade. Both have the ability to get on top of the bowling and a capable of quality stroke play.

All 33 players who played in the 5th grade were cohesive, committed and spirited and I would like to thank them for their support, their mateship and contribution toward the teams performances.

What can I say about my first year as captain ?. Challenging, exciting, nail biting, frustrating maybe, but one thing for sure I enjoyed it. Right from the outset our novice team with its blend of youth and experience was always going to be a good chance at a grade premiership.

We began the 96/97 season with a one dayer against Bedford/Morley. We were sent into bat and after a solid start would you believe it but apple crumble. We then went out and bowled but could not hold them out of the game.

Applecross 6th Grade were now on the ladder and were all eager to put the first win on the board. Sadly round two was as bad as round one, another loss. All things come in threes and it was a relief to stick it up Curtin Uni and post our first win.

We were ready to take on anybody and travelled to Fremantle/Mosman Park. It turned out that after a marvellous first week we got flogged the second week, mind you it poured with rain most of the day. By this time I was hoping the phone would ring with someone was going to offer me a job in Alaska.

I was unsure where we were going wrong or was it my inexperience as a captain. To Christmas we were three losses, two wins and one draw. Very ordinary for the team we had. After Christmas the team had a few changes but didn't do much for our losing form. Three losses, two of them outright.
