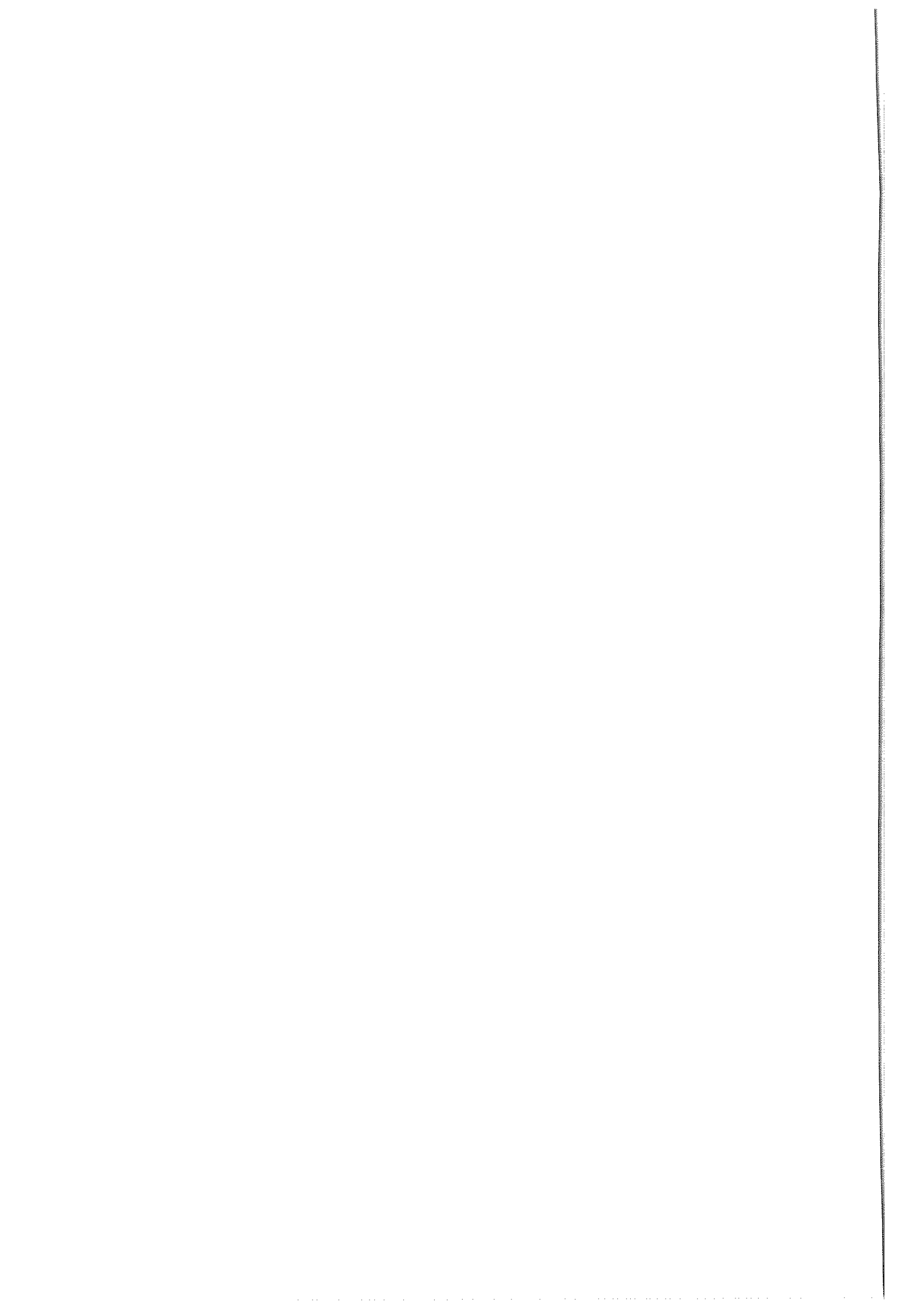

President's Report:

Without any previous Presidential experience and the proposition of taking over the helm of a club that had unfortunately earned the nickname of "Apple Crumble", and to add to that the prospect of a complete revamp of most committee and captaincy positions, I approached the season 98/99 with caution. It was obvious to all of the committee that improvement had to be made in areas such as player commitment and dedication and also in financial security of the club. A commitment to these two areas I thought would help to improve the club in ladder positions and in achieving some of our long-term goals of which until now have only been dreams.

I think the club making inroads to both those commitments during the year can be attributable in the main to three individuals. In the on-field area I believe the catalyst to our successes this season came with the re-appointing of Tommy Morgan in the coach/coordinating role and the addition of Gerry Marquis as 1st XI captain. In the financial situation there is no doubt that total dedication to the task by Dean Phillips this season has really helped strengthen our position. Subsequently the tireless efforts of these three individuals and many others has helped gain the improved success of the club this year, with the cream on the cake being that we had 3 sides into finals and eventually finishing second in the WAY 79 club championship, our highest position ever.

Although seasons don't come and go without hitches, and this one was no different, the highs well out-pointed the lows and this made for a very pleasing year for myself and I'm sure many others. I can see the club moving in very positive directions over the oncoming years and with a positive approach from the committee, captains and the players we should have no problems achieving our goals. I believe that the addition of the three gentlemen mentioned previously to senior positions and the addition of quality players in the like of Mark Hullet, Justin Crowder, Simon Luckhurst and Greg Brautigian has added a quality edge to the band of seasoned performers that we have had for years. If we can maintain the bulk of these players and bolster the batting strength we can become a 1st XI force to be reckoned with.

Some of the other achievements during the year were the fostering of a stronger link with the Ardross Junior Cricket Club and again Tommy should be thanked for getting up early on Sunday mornings to coach the under 17's. This was made a more monumental effort in the fact that he had to co-ordinate training for them on the same nights that he had to coach the senior squad. Hopefully with careful planning and patience we will be able to develop an even stronger commitment with the juniors over the next couple of years. The other significant achievement was the addition of a bowling machine to our training equipment and this year it has proven to be a bonus for players wanting specialized batting practice as well as alleviating the pressures on bowlers required to fill four nets.

In closing I would again like to thank everyone for their efforts this season and especially the new committee on how they approached this year and hopefully we can maintain the nucleus for next year and give it a real dip. Have a great winter break and see you all at pre-season training for the club's 25th year.

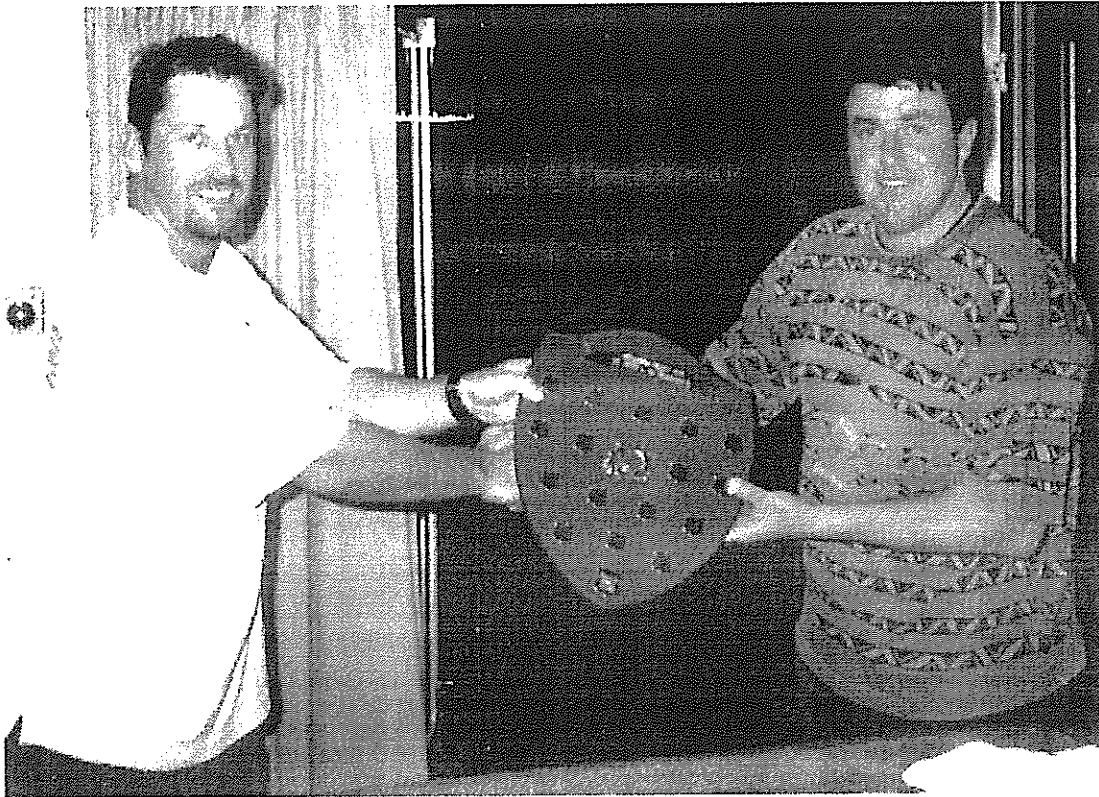

Life Membership – George Prince

At the club presentation night George Prince was presented with Life Membership of the Applecross Cricket Club. George now joins an elite list of life members of the club.

George joined the Applecross Cricket club in the 1979/80 season when the club was based at Mandala Reserve in Bateman now known as Bill Ellson Reserve.

In the 20 years with the club George has been and still is a fine player, has been on the Committee and is now the club statistician and club historian.

George's statistical achievements with the club are very impressive. They include:

- having played over 170 games for the club
- one of only three players to have made over 3000 runs
- one of only two players to have taken over 100 catches
- three topside premierships sides
- winning the batting aggregate in the club's topside on three occasions
- captained the club's second team.
- 1st ACC player to be selected in an Association side – colts 79/80

Some of George's individual highlights include:

- Held the catch off Burt Baetson's bowling to win the 81/82 fourth grade grand final and the club's first premiership.
- Batted with Phil Holman in a partnership of 113 to win the second grade premiership. Chasing 141 on a damp wicket in a game reduced to a one-day game ACC collapsed to be 4/25 however George was joined by Phil Holman and together they set up the win. The club history records it as:

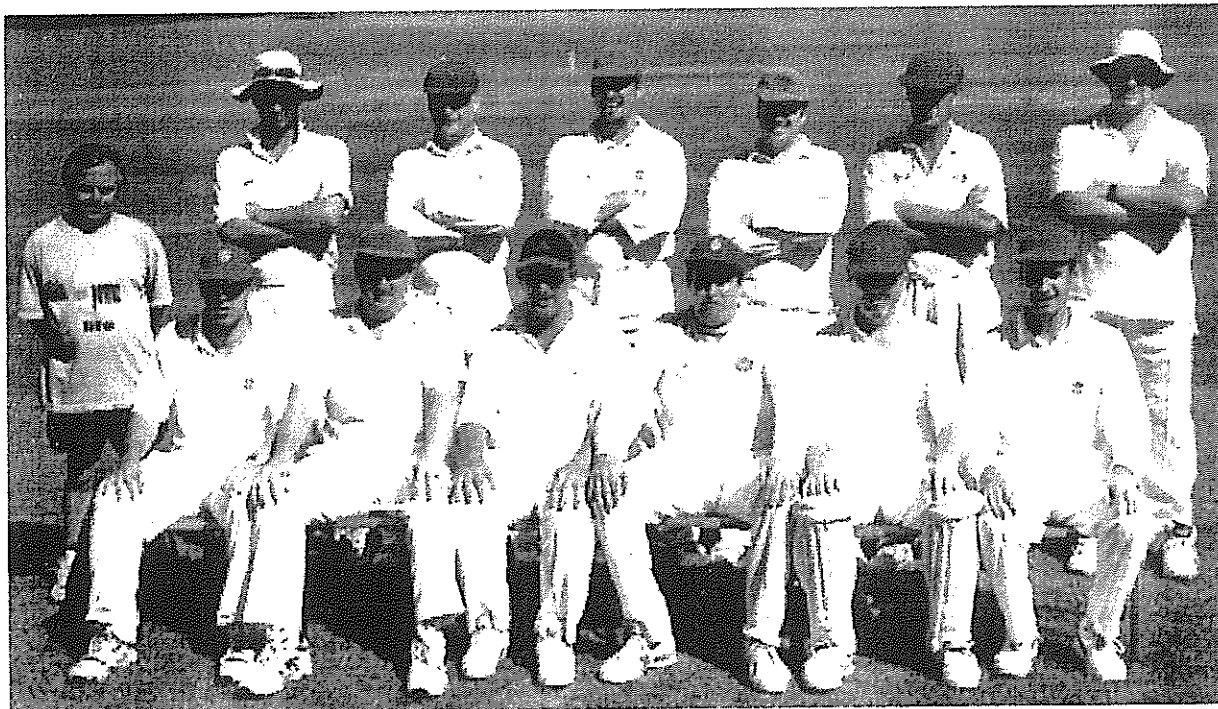
In reply we were in big trouble at 4/25 but then Phil Holman and George Prince took the attack apart, adding 113 in just 65 minutes. Phil smashed 78 and was dismissed 3 runs short of victory. George finished 38 not out and we won by 5 wickets.

- In 1997 George was named in the club's alltime best 11.

George has also been a tireless worker and supporter of the club and with the support and understanding of his wife Carol and the boys, Daniel and Matthew, has been a stalwart of the club in both the good times and hard times.

Life membership is a special award that is presented to long time club members who have made significant contributions to the success of the club both on and off the field. George has done that and his record of achievement in both these facets of club life is recognised and appreciated by his fellow members, past, current and future.

Season 1998/99 started full of promise. We had two prize recruits in Justin Crowder and Simon (pommy joke) Luckhurst (unfortunately only one was able to start the season on time) and a young English bloke (read another pommy joke) lob at the club willing to play in Graham Cashin. By the time the pre season ended we had also acquired Steve Laden from Bassendean and a handy young quick from Darwin (You'll never, never know), Greg Brautigan. More Poms (jokes) to take the piss out of and a whisper that Mark Hullet was soon to return from the motherland (four years past his visa) and a game not played as yet.

As you can see when you add the above names to the usual suspects from Applecross you get some handy depth and talent in abundance. Unfortunately we played really well when things were going our way and looked bloody ordinary in a couple of crucial games. In the end we were probably a mere eights runs extra in the right places and we would have finished second. The tie against Nollamara and the six run loss against the nice guys Swanbourne proved critical in us achieving success.

Without dwelling on our bad times too much, I feel the area where we as a team need to improve is the way we approach the upcoming game. I have never seen a bunch of guys so fired up to kill a side as when we trained prior to the Whitfords win. But the reverse of that was how flat we were in games that we should have won on paper against Marist Newman, Shenton Park, Swanbourne and Wembley Downs. Our inconsistency is shown up in our individual stats; I can not remember in any of the seasons that I have been down here that one if not two bowlers reached 30 wickets for the season and while two guys achieved 350 runs from 9 digs for the season there wasn't any other significant input from our top 7 bats. Too often we were relying on one or two batsmen to get us a score and one or two bowlers to make the crucial breakthrough. Instead (this goes for all sides) we should be wanting to be the bloke that stands up and takes charge of the situation no matter how dire it appears to be. To achieve this there needs to be a better attitude from first grade and potential first grade players towards training. This does not mean you just show your face and go through the motions, you put in and show that you not only want that 1st grade spot but demand it with work ethic, resolve and results.

That is the gripe over and done with. I must apologise because I know this does not apply to all players all the time, but it does some of the time for all of us. Overall I can take away some real pluses from this season. The win loss ratio of our lower grade sides is fantastic and has helped the club achieve second place in the WAY 79 club championship. Now we have to concentrate on the way we win, we need to consistently score 200 runs plus and bat our 30 or 72 overs out to continue on with this success and also to have success in the finals.

The unearthing of a couple of future prospects from within the club and junior system is great news. The players I speak of are Ben Warne, Chris Teede, Ryan Greenwell and Gareth Parker. I know most of these guys have been here a couple of years now but their

personal year's work and further development has been brilliant and their progression through the ranks is very pleasing to see.

I just thought that I would go through some highlights from the season this year from a captain's perspective. Gaining that first win in the first game against eventual premiers High Wycombe was very satisfying. To come from a long pre season and bad weather leading into it and to win so convincingly was a brilliant effort from all the guys. Beating Tuart Hill at Lickerland was a big test for the guys after the appalling first 20 overs that we bowled to these crabs. The way we put ourselves back into that game was brilliant and a huge test of character for the boys, Justin Crowder got a Michelle (5 for) and Perer and Cheese belted them (Pep on one leg). Beating Whitfords!! enough said there with Lucky and Pep to the fore with the bat and good bowling and fielding. The tie at Nollamara for all the wrong reasons, we really let that one slip. With Hully getting his Michelle and not polling a vote at the association medal count. Outright against Curtin 9th grade. A good all round effort with lots of contributions but Pep and Crowder with bat and Crowds (again) and myself with the ball, thanks for holding your catches boys they were my best figures ever (8 for 30) and Oldy's snare at short leg. Finally the Bassendean debacle, noteworthy for the rear guard batting by PJ (32), Hully (23), and Cam Stirling (48*) and the sledging from the peanut gallery of Hully, Kapo, Oldy and Lucky.

I'd just like to finish by saying thanks to all the guys that played under my captaincy this year. I have enjoyed the experience thoroughly and even though I am sometimes grumpy and critical of our performances it is only because we have the chance to achieve so much more with the cattle that we have and I want to be a part of that. Thank you also to Tom Morgan for his support and efforts at training this year, another top effort, Brett MacGregor who has achieved wonderful things at our club this year and I hope he continues his reign for a few more years because his dedication is unmatched down the club and Lawrence Bensusan, Joe Venter, Angus Castley and Tyrone Murphy (go Hawks!) for their help, guidance and support throughout the season and congratulations on your achievements with your teams.

Captain's Report:**3rd Grade****Lawrence Bensusan**

It was a great honour to be appointed as captain of the Applecross 2 eleven for the 98/99 season. Having played the previous season and ending up mid table I firmly believed we under achieved and could have done a lot better. My aim was to try and win those close games that could go either way, and to pick the next best 11 in the club, on performance ability and attitude.

Our season was affected by bad weather and out of the eleven qualifying games we had 4 games reduced to 45 overs a side games. Our first of these four games was against High Wycombe where we successfully defended 118 to bowl out the opposition for 113. Next of the limited over games we bowled Tuart Hill out for 84 and scored 120 in reply. Our third one dayer saw us chase 131 successfully and end up on 132. Our last one-day game was against Nollamara and we defended 105 to bowl them out for 97. With 4 one dayers out of 6 games it was difficult to judge how our batting was going. We seemed to going well as a team and there were vital match winning contributions form Doug Stirling, Richard Mulroney, Cam Stirling, Ryan Greenwell and myself. With the ball Richard Mulroney with 6/24 and Ben Warne with 4/14 did well.

As for the 2-day qualifiers we played one on turf and five on hard decks. We won all five on the hard decks and in the two-day version managed to post scores of 228 and 71, 234, 245 and 57, 162 and 89, and 171. On the turf game we could only manage 154 against Whitfords and resulted in the only loss for the whole season. In this game we let the last pair of the hook after having them 9/131. A game we should have won.

In the two day games with the bat there were some excellent contributions from Jeff Orchard 37, 27, 23, 68, 44. From Doug Stirling, who only played 4 games for us, scores of 81 and 34. From Matthew Halliday 46, Peter Jordan 23, 25, 44, 84 and from Richard Mulroney 24, 46, 56. Cam Stirling who at one point averaged 100! made scores of 29, 17, 44, 16, 33, 34. From myself scores of 37, 22, 81, 36, 60, 35. There were also notable contributions from Ryan Greenwell who consistently scored runs in the high teens and low twenties and from Ben Warne and Greg Brautigan who scored in the teens regularly. Brad Favas, who held up an end on occasions to help us win a couple of close ones, ended up with 6 not outs during the season.

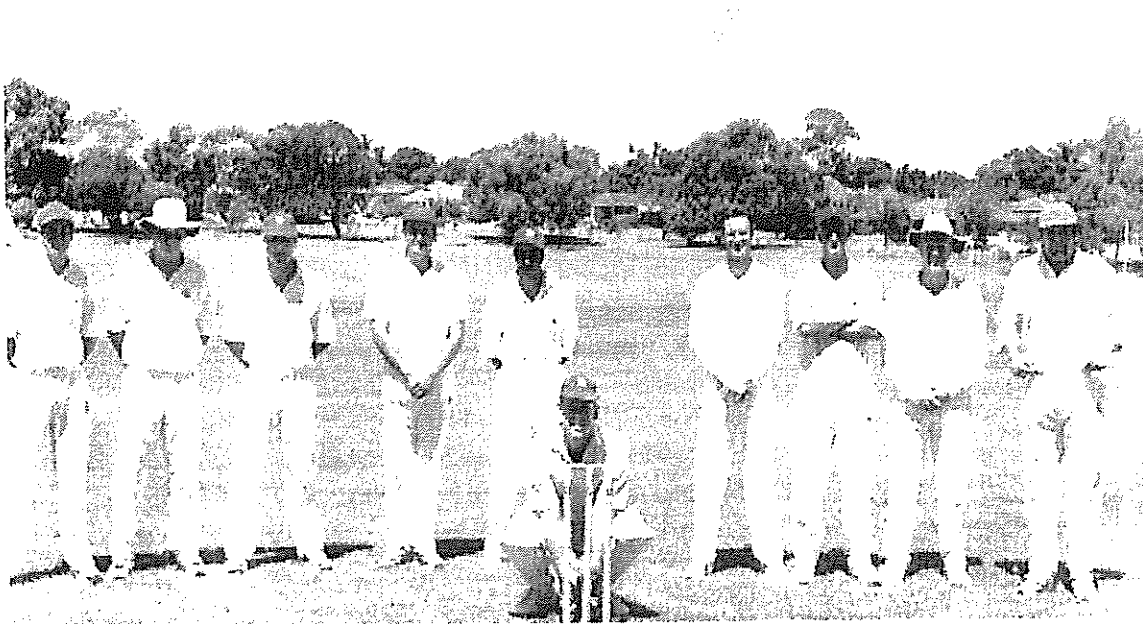
As for the bowlers there were good performances from Ben Warne who took 7/54 against Wembley Downs, 4/19 against Nollamara and 2 for on a few other occasions. Richard Mulroney was consistent with the ball for the whole season, and Greg Brautigan 3/27, 3/49, 2/30 and 4/25 who's pace and accuracy unnerved a few batsmen. Cam Stirling bowled consistently well taking 20 wickets for the season. Brad Favas kept a steady line and was a run miser throughout the season. Ryan Greenwell was ever reliable behind the stumps and made few errors throughout the season.

The spirit of the side throughout the season was fantastic and as the season progressed we got better and better. Our campaign ended with ten wins and only one loss.

Unfortunately our semi final did not go as planned. We played in a rain reduced game of 45 overs per side against Nollamara on a wet, under prepared pitch that the groundsman did not believe was fit to play on. However, one of the umpires (just so happens to be a Nollamara Life Member) decided it was fit to play on.

What occurred was a 'slogathon' as neither side could bat well in these conditions. Four doubtful decisions all went against us and they scored 128 and we scored 126.

I would like to thank everyone at the club, the committee, the President Brett McGregor for giving me the opportunity to prove I was worthy of the role and to everybody who played in my side during the season. I feel very proud of what we achieved and hopefully next season we will be premiership winners.

It has been a great privilege for me to have had the opportunity to captain the aptly named "Thirsty Thirds" this season. After selection for the first round I realised what an honour it was to be asked to captain a side with such a wealth of experience. The eleven team members selected for round one had played nearly eight hundred games of cricket for Applecross alone and no doubt many more counting games played with other clubs.

The season could not have got off to a better start. We played the opening game "one dayer" against High Wycombe and having won the toss and batted, had an association 5th grade opening partnership record before we had lost our first wicket for the season. Congratulations to Tom Morgan and Jeff Orchard on their record partnership of 189. This set us up for a comfortable win but in round two we unsuccessfully chased 154 against the eventual minor premiers Wembley and it soon became evident that without either Tommy Morgan or Rob Pulley getting runs the balance of the order was brittle and we would struggle. Victory in rounds three and four had us back on course, but in round five we got beaten by five wickets by the eventual premiers Whitfords. This loss came in spite of an excellent bowling performance from Neil Watt who took 7 for 63. This game showed a batting weakness against spin bowling. This weakness was further exposed when we were defeated in round six by lowly Shenton Park when again we failed to successfully chase 158 against a fairly average attack. This loss meant we went into the Christmas break three and three and looking doubtful as finalist contenders.

If our finals prospects looked bleak when we returned from the break, they were all but buried by tea on day one of our first game back. Having won the toss and batted we were bowled out for a paltry 38 by Balcatta. Our opposition had a first grade bowler available for the first Saturday only and he did most of the damage. Balcatta then declared at three for fifty and had another nineteen overs at us with their A grader. At stumps we were two for 48. Day two saw a quick run chase, the highlight being an 80 run partnership in 60 minutes between Tommy Morgan and Rob Pulley and we were able to declare at 4 for 180 setting Balcatta 169 in 42 overs to win. A tremendous bowling effort, in particular by Duncan Collie(4 for 19 in 12 overs) and excellent fielding saw us knock them over for 77 and give us victory by 91 runs. A remarkable game of cricket and one that I am sure all of us who played will remember for many years to come.

That victory really was the turning point for the team and we won our next four games in a row to finish the regular season with a 8 and 3 record and third place on the ladder 14 points ahead of the fourth placed team. This gave us a semi-final draw against Whitfords at McDonald Park. We won the toss and batted, and on an extremely slow outfield against some tight bowling, managed only 136. This was achieved in 71.3 overs which meant that we very nearly batted out our allocated overs. We were always a chance with some runs on the board but unfortunately we ended up going down by one wicket in the second to last over. This was in spite of some excellent bowling, the pick of which was Brian Seymour with 4 for 49 off 21 overs.

It was, of course, a devastating feeling to get so close and then miss out when it really mattered. So where did we go wrong and what could we have done differently? With the benefit of hindsight we probably were one bowler light in the final and perhaps the first mistake we made was at the selection table. I, as captain, must shoulder full responsibility for this. Then there is the old adage that catches win matches and we were guilty of dropping two crucial catches.

At the end of the day however we were not good enough when it really mattered and I only hope the bitter disappointment at our loss will spur us all on to work harder next season. I am sure that the younger players, in particular, will have benefited from the experience of playing finals cricket and my hope is that they will use this to bring a flag to Applecross next year.

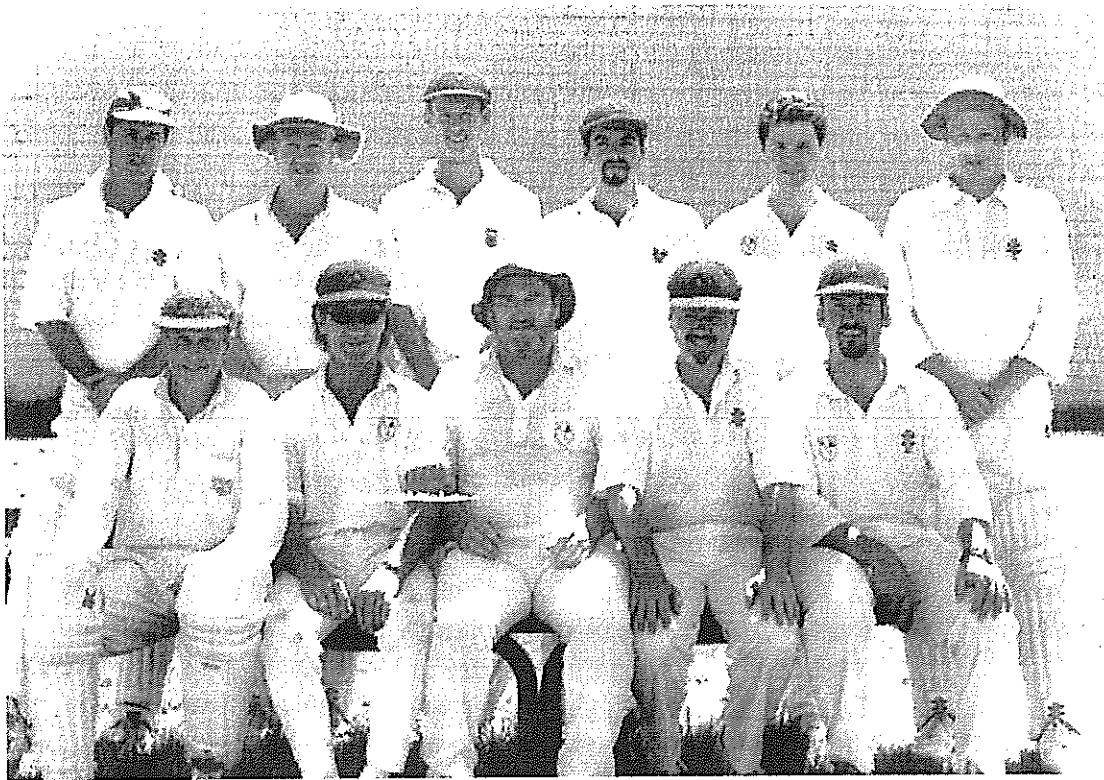

Firstly the emergence of Chris Teede as an opening bat was a big positive. Ben Warne's leg spin will see him take many more wickets. Also Greg Brautigian did very well progressing all the way to A grade and we hope he will be back at Applecross in the near future. Gareth Parker improved in the batting department and will, I hope, play many successful games for the club. Marcus Singline returned to outdoor cricket this year and showed potential with the ball. He battled with injury this season but if fit next year will take his share of wickets. Although no longer in the "young" cricketer class I would like to make mention of Dunc Collie who learned to "late" swing the ball away from the bat this year and who will take many more wickets for the club.

Particular thanks to Brett McGregor for phoning scores through, Duncan Collie for providing the drinks and Chris Teede for organising the change room refreshments. I would like to make special mention of the role played by Rob Pulley. As vice captain Rob took on numerous responsibilities all of which he did very well. His organisation of fines, gimmicks and the weekly "draw" made for a happy team off the paddock. Thank you Donny, I couldn't have wished for a better vice captain.

Last, but by no means least, thanks to my wife Cheryl, not only for making the teas but also for putting up with the many hours spent away from home in the name of cricket.

Season 1998/1999 was a memorable one for the 4th XI who were desperately unlucky not to make finals and at finals time, were the form side in the competition.

The season got off to a bad start with a one day loss to Wembley in the first round followed by a loss in our first two day game against Tuart Hill.

It was then that a stroke of luck occurred in that regular Captain, Angus Castley, was unavailable and handed the reigns to his deputy, Hubert Baetsen, who led the side to its first victory of the season against Bedford Morley.

The next game saw us face Thornlie where a further hard fought win was achieved but not without Thornlie dropping at least 10, and possibly more, catches in the field to allow us to win. This game also saw the debut of Adrian Reynolds in the side, the eventual Batting Award winner, who on debut made 72 run out and was ably supported by Vince Stackpole who made 40 not out at a crucial time to ensure victory.

The next game against Whitfords saw a soft loss with us capitulating for 113 runs and at that stage we sat the team down and decided that it was time to start playing some positive aggressive cricket to get back on track.

From that point on we remained undefeated and over the course of the season achieved wins against all finalists apart from Whitfords.

Of particular note were wins against Nollamara (who up until the week before had not lost a game in 1 ½ seasons of cricket), Fremantle Mosman Park where we recovered from 6 for 101 to make 224 all out, and a victory against the top side, Bassendean, in the final game of the season.

It is, in fact, at this point that the tale of woe begins.

- Going into the final game we were approximately 170 runs (or 1.7 points) behind Bedford Morley who were in 4th position and we were facing the top side.
- Batting first we made 9 for 261, batting out our full 72 overs for the first time that season and then rolled Bassendean for 111 off 53 overs.
- Highlights of the match were a 132 run partnership between Castley and Wilton, with Wilton scoring 86 and magnificent bowling efforts of 2 for 7 from Wilton, 3 for 17 from Dean Phillips and 4 for 24 from Burt Baetsen.

We had arranged for Vince Stackpole to be at the Bedford Morley game and he was relaying scores to us as the game progressed. Going in at 10 minutes past 5 we batted for 13 overs hitting 100 runs and, by our calculations, had made it into the finals by 0.03 points or 3 runs.

Later when the official scorecards were handed in Bedford Morley made a complaint that from a previous game they were not awarded their full points (due to a failure by their captain to complete the score sheet properly) and subsequently they were awarded an extra wicket which enabled them to enter the four at our expense by 0.17 points.

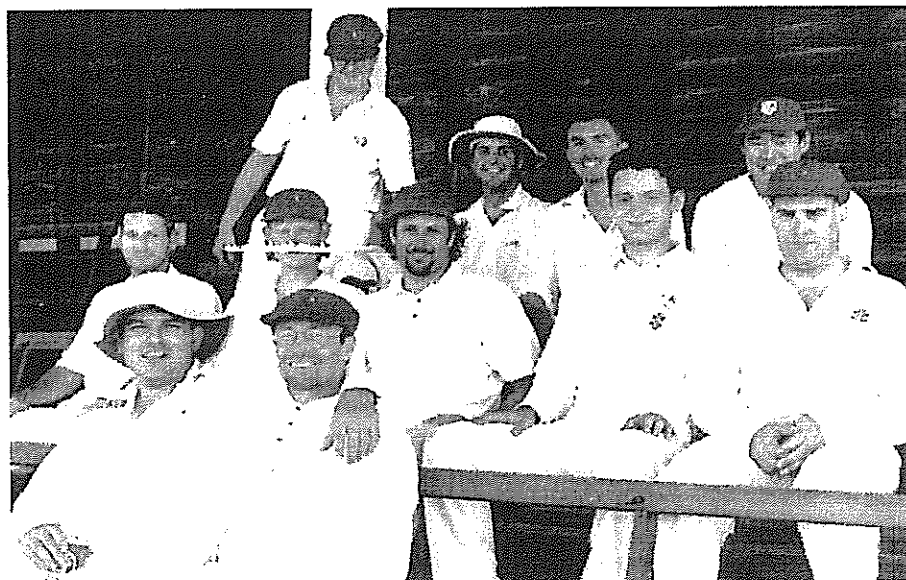
Like all Applecross players, I do not bear a grudge but I was happy to see that they were knocked out of the finals in the first week by Whitfords.

In retrospect it was a fantastic effort from the boys who all bonded together after our loss to Whitfords and performed admirably.

Highlights were Burt's bowling, Kenn McPherson's fielding, the opening batting of Adrian Reynolds, the all round ability of Rob Wilton, improved efforts behind the stumps from Andrew Stampalia, the big game bowling performances of Dean Phillips and some timely innings by blokes like Crowie, Kenny McPherson and Burt when they were absolutely needed.

Ramon Fletcher was probably one of the best but least lucky bowlers in the year and finished with 14 wickets. We learnt about the vagaries of cricket having at least 15 or 20 catches dropped off his bowling over the course of the season.

After a few seasons in the wilderness 98/99 saw a welcome return to the finals for ninths on the back of some very enthusiastic and enjoyable cricket.

The season started successfully on the scoreboard but rather indifferently in terms of player numbers. We won our first three games but I felt like a major sponsor of Telstra as I called anyone and everyone in endeavouring to get a team on the park. The low point came on round 4 selection night when there were only four players available. But the word had got around about how much of a treat it was to play for ninth's this year and by round 5 there were twenty-one players to select from. The strong numbers continued for the remainder of the season and I thank any player who was missed out on selection for their understanding.

We managed to win eleven of our fourteen qualifying games to finish the season second on the ladder. Our three losses were all tight games with the losing margins being one wicket, eighteen runs and nine runs respectively. We bowled and fielded superbly during the year but on occasions our batting let us down. This was never more evident than in the finals.

In the semi-final we batted first and could only manage 67 with Ron Kang (23) the only batsman to show any fight. We went out and bowled and fielded like men possessed to have Wembley reeling at 6/42 at stumps on day one, with Nick Ashbrook shaking up the opposition with a fiery spell and figures of 3/13. With the option of either moving grounds or abandoning the game I chose the latter. This put us through to the grand final due to finishing higher on the ladder than Wembley.

An outstanding performance in the game came from Andy Randalls who saved us from embarrassment with a dogged 50. Gareth Parker was the best of the rest scoring 16 in a second wicket partnership of 41 with Andy. Nick Ashbrook was once again the pick of the bowlers with 5/16 off 18 overs.

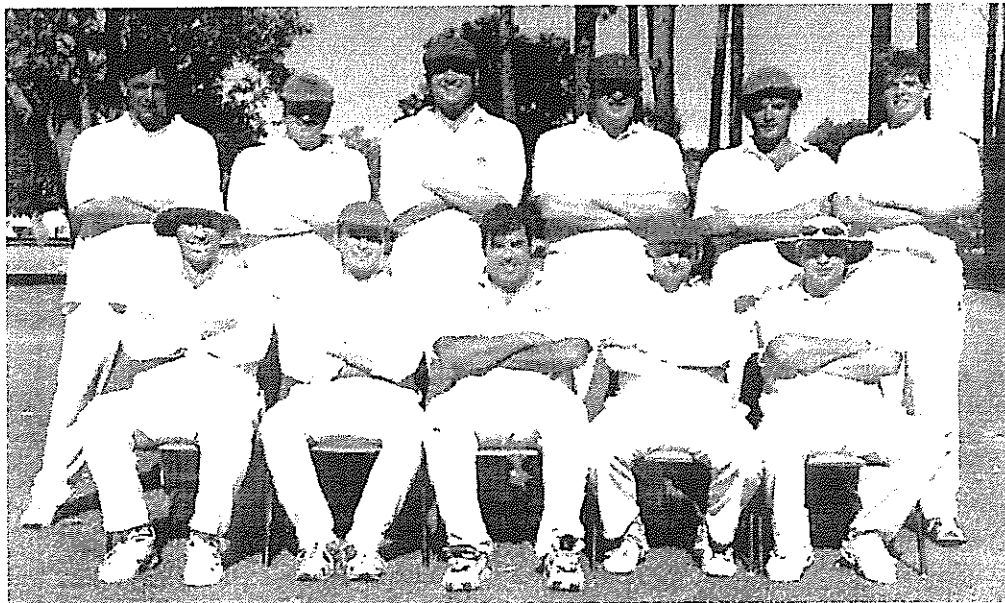
The grand final side in batting order was:

A special mention to Glen Wright who worked tirelessly throughout the year to make my job a lot easier. Finally, I'd like to thank everyone who played in Ninth's this year and hope that you enjoyed the season. It was a very rewarding experience to captain the side and I wish all of you the best of luck with your cricket in the future.
