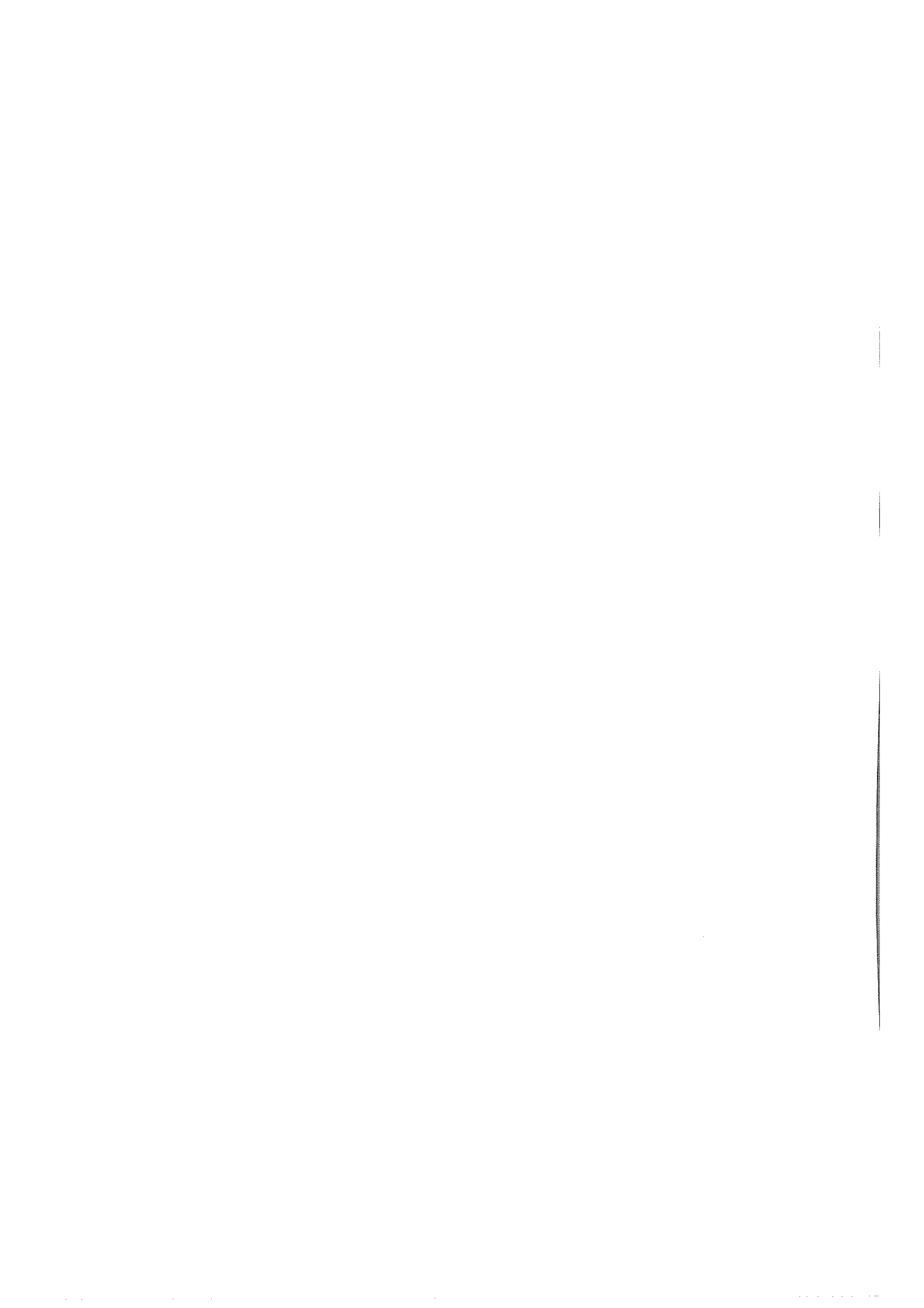

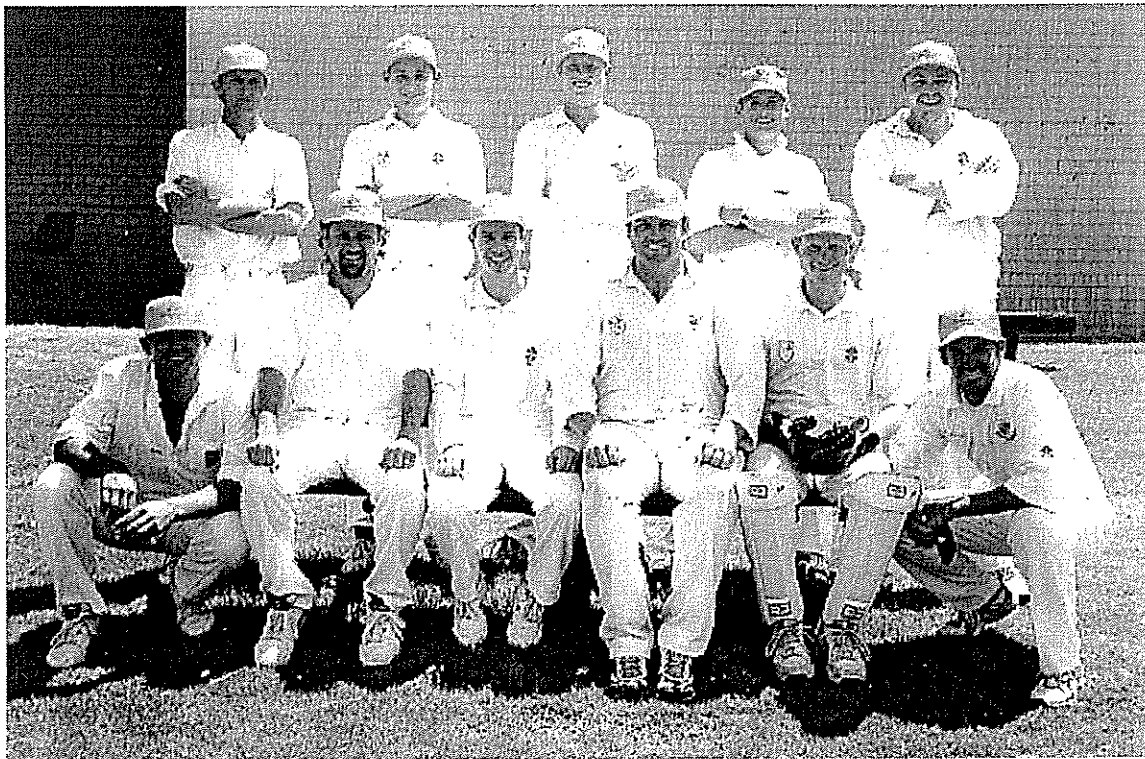

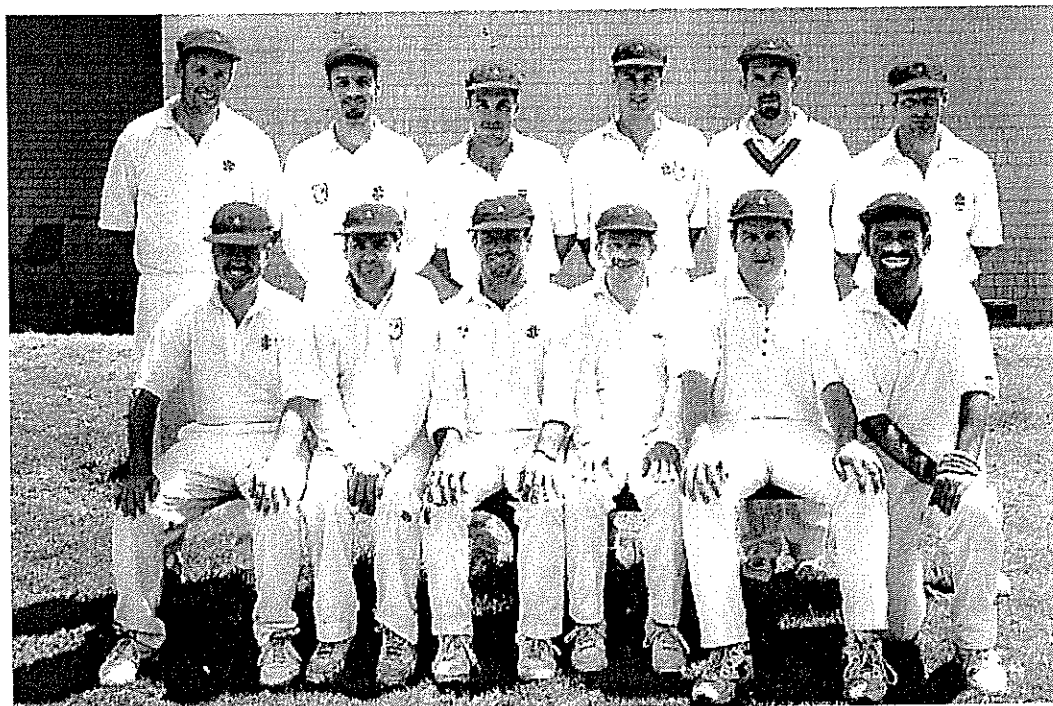

Thank you to Brett and his committee for their support during a sometimes difficult year for me, but one that I enjoyed immensely.

Cricket season's come and go so quickly these days that the "A" grade player group we have at Applecross are risking retirement amid the haze of under achievement. An attitude of near enough is good enough permeates the squad and while this is most obvious in the tedious environment of training, we are not talented enough to just switch to our highest standards when match situations demand. Practice drills and discipline must be learned and adhered to so that when pressure confronts us, we make correct instinctive decisions. Only then will our statistics improve.

The 2000/2001 season yielded 6 impressive wins and 5 equally disappointing losses. Looking for early momentum we were stuck in on a damp Kent St wicket and rolled cheaply by Shenton Park. A comfortable win against Thornlie at home eased some nerves, although Cameron Stirling suffered a mystery knee injury, which ruined his season. The Greg Oldfield (121) show began in round 3 where we thumped Wembley Downs after amassing a club "A" grade record score of 332/8. Curiously, this arch rival is the only side we have beaten twice in the last 2 years. Greg and Chris Mole each made tidy half centuries in round 4 against Nollamara but lacked support as we crumbled for 177. Gerry Marquis fired us into contention with 7 top order wickets but apart from Justin May's frugal opening spell, the support bowling was poor.

Round 5 produced a fighting home win against Subiaco Marist, Brad Weir helping restrict the visitors and then Greg and Anthony Barranca seeing us home with the bat. A one-day "Team Effort" win away to High Wycombe put us in the top 4 at the Christmas break with everything to play for.

We managed a couple of impromptu net sessions during the lay off, knowing that critical games against Whitfords and Swanbourne immediately followed the break. While the attendance level was good at these sessions, they lacked intensity, and I felt we were distracted, we had rested on our laurels – Near enough was good enough. A pair of fair dinkum floggings resulted and effectively pushed us out of the top 4 contention, both opposition sides showing us what is required to play Suburban Turf finals cricket.

In a pleasing return to form, we managed to upset Balcatta's push to the finals by bowling them out cheaply and eking out the required runs. Our hopes were alive when we visited Tuart Hill with our best eleven finally available. Sent in on a seaming menace after overnight rain, we scrambled to 180 with handy lower order contributions from Al Field and myself, and then had them 2/10 overnight. Gerry and Justin continued the rot in week 2 and we rolled them for 150, no doubt the most gratifying victory of our season against a side who would go on to lose the grand final to Whitfords.

We all know that relying on results in the last round is not the way to approach our cricket. Bassendean were our opponents in round 11 and, having bowled them out for under 200, I think we took our eyes off the ball. A fifth top order collapse out of 5 games (post Christmas) sealed our fate as we surrendered the chance to finish the season with 7 wins and 4 losses.

As it happens, this would not have been quite good enough to pinch a finals berth either way. Our attention to detail must become sharper as we play in a competition where bonus points (and in particular 2nd innings points) play a critical role in the regular log-jam for top 4 positions. To feature at the pointy end of the season will require improvement in our top order batting output, improvements in our support bowling standards (Only Gerry and Justin) and improvements in our catching and general ground fielding. But this is all academic unless we show an ability to seize the vital moment in a game as a result of consistent and disciplined efforts on the track and at the nets.

Near enough is NOT good enough.

Captain's Report:**3rd Grade****Robert Pulley**

This season can be summed up in one word, disappointing. Only a few players can hold their heads up after a very hard and frustrating summer.

The season started with 3 straight wins, followed by 7 losses in a row. Good wins over Shenton Park, Thornlie and Wembley Downs, should have set us up for a shot at the finals, but it wasn't to be. To lose the next 7 games was pretty poor and as a captain I found out a few things about several players. The talent was endless with the youth policy together with several experienced 50 game plus players. In the end our catching was pathetic at times and our batsmen's shot selection woeful. There wasn't one team that we played that could boast a better allround bowling attack, but we let ourselves down in attitude, discipline, and general enthusiasm.

Players that did stand up were, Doug Stirling with 347 runs at 49.5, Nick Edwards' 250 plus at 36.5, also Matt Halliday and Simon Shalders showed good form on occasions. With the ball Matt Jackson took 23 wickets at 16.17, Duncan Collie performed well as did Ben Warne. Ramon Fletcher has a big future as he showed that he can perform at this level and also I'm sure even higher. Our fielding as I have said was poor apart from Damian O'Hara who was magnificent behind the stumps.

To sum up with the talent on hand a very bad year. A few players need to look at themselves and put in on the training track. It just doesn't happen that easily.

Congratulations to all players who took the field for the Applecross 5th grade this year. After narrowly losing the season opener in a cliffhanger we fought our way back to 4th spot and an opportunity to defend our title. The spirit and comradery shown by all throughout the season were key factors to our success.

There were many highlights when you reflect back on the year comprising some brilliant individual and team efforts and also some major milestones. Probably 2 of the most notable were Vice Captain Brett "Snake" McGregor notching up his 200th game and passing 350 wickets.

Rob "Roy" Wilton also managed to pick up his 100th wicket for the club, which is amazing considering 43 of them were taken this season and he missed one game.

There were also quite a few new faces to bolster the ranks of the reigning premiers, these included Steve Coyle, Tony "HBF" Moffitt and his brother Rob "Medicare Private" Moffitt, Marcus "Crackers" Willey, Mike "Cha Ching" King, Nathan "Pethers - *the clean version*" Petherick and Paul Ozanne who all made valuable contributions throughout the season – especially during fines session!

Tony Moffitt started the season well with 3/22 and 2nd top score in his first game.

Chris "Seedy" Teede scored a brilliant 80 against Wembley before fatigue (probably hangover induced) set in. The other batting highlight in that game was a brilliant 2nd innings partnership of 63 in just 9 overs by none other than VC Snake (41 n.o. - including 2 huge "Dorothies" to cow!) and Andrew Stampalia. Duncan "Flash" Collie opened his account with a 2/29 and Rob Wilton cleaned up with 4/25 supported by "HBF" with 2/18.

One of our strongest team batting performances resulted from the game against Wembley Downs with a substantial 5/282 being posted from 72 overs. Everyone got amongst the runs with "Stamps" leading the way with 78 and Steve Coyle making his maiden 50 for the club. Paul Ozanne in his maiden game (for ACC) chipped in with a well-smashed 34 in quick time. The Snake proved that "he's still got it" taking 4/20 with the ball.

The ever-reliable Rob Wilton picked up his best figures for the season against Nollamara with an outstanding 5/21 to set up our 3rd victory. Solid contributions from the middle order - Snake (32), Marcus Willey (23) and Brad "Sea Horse" Weir rubbing salt into the wound with 36 n.o.

The bowlers in the Subi Marist game put in what could only be described as a marathon effort – Ramon "Fabio" Fletcher taking 5/96 from 30 overs & Brad "Sexual" Favas 4/43

from 27 overs. All that effort and the bastards still won! Steve Coyle batted brilliantly for 70.

The "one dayer" before Xmas proved to be a Slogfest with ACC posting an impressive 4/189 from 40 overs. The stars of the show were Rob Wilton who "Pulled the Trigger" a couple of times for 44 and Cam "Buzz" Stirling who finished with 42 n.o. including 4 big zacks. "Hack" Wycombe proved almost equal to the task going down in the 2nd last over 8 runs short, thanks to "Roy" (again) with 3/41 and "Sexual" who bowled tight as the proverbial at "the death" for 4/56.

In the GF rematch against our good friends Whitfords (Do Dah, Do Dah!) at Stricko Cooky (5/18) destroyed us with impeccable outswing bowling to bundle us out for a pathetic 62. "Buzz" rattled them early snaring a couple but unfortunately, they got over the line eventually being dismissed for 124. Sexual worked extremely hard to take his best haul for the season with 5/34. Some "Ticker" was shown in the 2nd dig with the combination of Marcus Willey (35 n.o.) and Mike King (49 n.o.) getting us to 1/96 at stumps.

The Swanbourne game introduced Rob Moffitt who returned 2/20 from 10 overs in his first outing for ACC - also an outstanding catch. Fabio slaughtered them in his 2nd spell finishing with 4/28. It looked like the first ton of the season would arrive and it almost did but for a freakish one hander at Midwicket leaving Stamps one run short! A great effort anyhow and ably supported by Gareth "White Maggot" Parker with 32.

The Balcatta game brought the end to a few bowling careers courtesy of an unbelievable 142 n.o. from Peter "PJ" Jordan. The fact that it was scored entirely in the session after tea was even more amazing. Unfortunately PJ was unable to suppress the urge and was subsequently fined many times for "Noting" about this glorious occasion. Mike King also notched up his first "Fitty" (63) for the club. Rob Wilton had another blinder taking 5/28 resulting in victory by almost 200 runs!

The game against Doubleview proved how fickle cricket can be - coming off a season best of 299 we were rolled for 120 chasing 131. Great effort from Nathan Petherick in the first dig to finish with 4/42 - especially after being belted into the next postcode by one of their batsmen and then bowling him out next ball!

Bentley were the only side that scored over 200 against us all season and also the only side we never bowled out - the bastards wouldn't let us, declaring 8 down with 1 over to go. We still won the game which was all we had to do to get into the finals. An unbelievable 91 in just over an hour from Rob Wilton was one of the highlights of the season and proved to be the difference between the 2 sides.

If I had to pick my favorite game for the season it would have to be the first final against Whitfords. This was easily our finest hour turning in a near faultless display in the field to back up one of the finest spells of fast bowling all season. Ramon Fletcher has a tendency to produce the goods on big occasions and Fabs didn't let us down with a

season best of 6/27 from 18 overs including 7 maidens! Ball of the day – Probably Rob Wilton's Offy that completely deceived our friend Scott Jarvis resulting in a spooned catch to Mike King at Midwicket! Whitfords were all out for 66! Even though we had a lot of cricket left to play, when Steve Coyle hit their opening bowler for six over mid wicket late Saturday afternoon, we new we were home! Solid contributors with the bat were Mike King (25), Steve Coyle (28), Rob Wilton (27) and Snake 21n.o. I'll never forget singing "that song" (albeit quietly) on their pitch!

There isn't much I can say about the grand final except to say that everyone gave it their best shot right to the very end and nobody could ask for more than that. Once again, a fantastic effort to get there after narrowly making the 4. Great performance from Mike King with the bat (36) and great effort from Marcus Willey with 3rd top score and 2 vital catches. The three main bowlers used put in a mammoth effort and beat the bat without luck on many occasions. Rob Wilton finished with 3/52 from 32 overs, Ramon Fletcher 3/46 from 18 overs and Brad Favas 1/30 from 18 overs.

Congratulations to all trophy winners – special mention to Ramon for narrowly missing out on the player of the finals (again!).

Special thanks to my good mate Brett McGregor for his support on and off the field and the ACC committee for their assistance.

Lastly, thanks to all the players for their support and for making it all so much fun.

Unfortunately, the bold goal that was set for the year ("back to back") was not to be this year.

As the season started we had only 5 of the grand final twelve in our side and it looked as though it would be a tough year. Losing players of the calibre of Wilton, ("Fabio") Fletcher, McGregor and Stampalia to the 3rd XI and players like Weir and Cawthan due to unavailability was always going to make this year more difficult than the previous one. Nevertheless we had an opportunity to blood some new players over the year who it is hoped will turn out to be long term higher grade players for the club. Without going through a blow by blow of the season (like last year's indulgent and long winded manifesto) I can say that we got off to a good start with a win in the first game of the season against South Perth which with a bit of luck and some more industrious batting on the second day may have seen us start the year with an outright.

The next game effectively determined our year. Against our great mates Bedford (keep some extra points up our sleeves that no-one knows about until after the last round) Morley we made a defensible 174 at Stricko and had them 8/103. Unfortunately it all went "pear-shaped" and they managed 194 after we put down some crucial chances. Had we won that game I feel that the season may have been a different story.

We were then thrashed to within inches of an outright by Doubleview who unveiled one of the cleanest hitting batsmen I have seen in 6th grade since Pennefather and Berzinski. A win against Shenton Park followed by a win against Thornlie mainly due to Crowy's maiden ton for the club put us back on track leading into the last game before Xmas against Fremantle/Mosman Park in a one dayer.

Freo were last on the table and we tried our best to lose a game we had no business losing (sounds like the footy this year!!). Thanks largely due to the efforts of Cliffo who returned to the club this year after a long hiatus we snuck away with a win and turned for the run home at 4 and 2 but not in the four. The first game of the new year was the grand final replay against Curtin/Vic Park who were aching to smash us after last year's result. We managed our best score of the year (260) and gave them a nice old pasting and thought we may be some sort of silly chance to fulfil our dream of back to back. We then lost to Whitfords, Hamersley Carine (where we saw the cleanest hitting ever by a bloke named Peterson who made 175n.o. in about two and a half hours) and Tuart Hill where we lost outright and finished the second day with only 9 batsmen. This was the lowest point of the season without a doubt.

The last game was against Bassendean where superb bowling saw us roll them for 87 and be 2/53 at the end of the day. We then did our best to lose and were 7/76 before falling over the line.

Despite the disappointment of missing the finals there were a few positives for the season:

- the debut of young Tristan ("Custard") Fletcher who showed a lot of potential as a spinner and was always willing to listen and learn;
- Crowy's maiden ton;
- the debut of Nathan ("Featherdick") Petherick who went on to play 2nd eleven cricket before the end of the season;
- the appearance of Stephen ("Son of Peter") Spencer for 2 games. Lets hope we see more of him as he is quality !!!;
- the return of Shaggers Markwart and Gary Hack; and
- the "debut" of Cliffo after many years.

I would like to thank all those with whom I played and had the pleasure to captain both during last year and over my 4 years as captain of the side. I would also like to thank the committee for the opportunity and congratulate the other captains for their efforts over a tough year.

What we must do as a club is realise that the success we crave will come from commitment and hard work on the track and that we cannot rest on the laurels of a good season the year before.

Special mention to Brad Douglas in his first year as captain of the 3rd XI as he took the side to a grand final. The side showed enormous character to narrowly lose in what was an intense contest for 2 days.

Next year let's all lift our game and make it a season to remember.

Captain's Report:**8th Grade****Brendan Tibbeck**

Season 2000/2001 started poorly for 8th Grade and for most of the season little improved. Our Captain and reigning Association batting average holder Brendan Tribbeck was out for most of the first half of the season with a knee injury and when he finally did return I ran him out for a duck. We had few wins in the early part of the season although two victories over our perennial nemesis Swanbourne were rewarding even despite them languishing below us on the ladder (there was only one place available for them to do this). So there is not much to talk about in terms of performance.

Each Saturday morning was spent chasing players after the inevitable domino effect due to players pulling out up the grades. We were constantly frustrated at the selection table when we uncovered players to plug holes only to see the talented ones disappear. This is by no means a slight on the 6th Grade captain but of the selection process itself. So it is left to me to beg those who play in higher grades to make a commitment to your team and your team mates so that lower grade teams may also have some semblance of regularity in our selection process. Enough said on that issue.

Having said all that, this season will stay in my mind as possibly the most enjoyable ever for two games. In the penultimate round we were placed second bottom and took on third placed High Wycombe away. We batted solidly after winning the toss and were 4 for 100 at tea. After tea, Brendan Tribbeck, no longer in danger of being run out after I gave my wicket away was joined by Nick Lyall one of the finds for 8th grade in season 2000/2001. Tribby hit a not out century and fifty nine from Nick Lyall got us to 7/268 at the end of play. We knew Tribby would not be available for week two but we also lost one of our opening bowlers, Guy Gibson to a large round ball game of the continental variety. We took the field with eight and this swelled to nine with the arrival of A. Sproul. Wickets did not come early but an inspired spell of medium pace outswing by Shane Nicholls left High Wycombe all out for 127 and Shane with 6/26. This was a satisfying win given that we fielded with only nine against a top team and saw some excellent performances from players who had been struggling for form.

The final game for the season was at Bassendean in 40 degrees. Again the selection table was cruel and when we lined up for two minutes silence to remember the Don, we lined up with eight players again – A. Sproul was already there. We lost the toss and were sent to bowl. Bassendean were placed second and had a strong batting attack - with eight fielders it was vital that we got early wickets so they did not have wickets in hand for happy hour. We were reasonably tight but they were only three wickets down at last drinks and we were not in the mood for a leather chase. Gary Leask and Steve Macken did not have bugles when they arrived but they were the cavalry to us having been freed by Gus to help as in our hour of need and indeed it was. After a very strong last hour with ten now claustrophobic fieldsmen who could no longer find any space, Bassendean finished at 7/227 which for them would have been a disappointing result in a field with

eight players. In the last hour they could no longer find gaps. Next week we fielded eleven. Paul Ozanne, unfamiliar in the opening role but forced to open as he had to leave at tea guided us to 5/120 at tea with a sparkling 86 – having thrown away a century as his deadline neared. Three quick wickets after tea had a struggling again until Bruce Rudrum (64) and Andrew Sproul (29) put on the required runs to get us past the target before Mr Sproul was ironically run out. I have played well over 100 games of cricket for various clubs and without a doubt this was the most satisfying and rewarding game I have ever played in. It was a privilege to have played with a team under such adversity and to have come through winners when at so many turns we looked the loser.

Apart from these there are not too many other memorable moments. Nick Lyall's failure to negotiate a roundabout at Swanbourne was undoubtedly one, as was the discovery of Nick himself and of Mike Shaw. Both are good cricketers, Nick as a bowling all rounder and Mike as an opening bat who can keep wickets but is a far better fielder. Both are quirky gentlemen who could justifiably hold their place in an Applecross SC XI. Bruce Rudrum and Andrew Sproul were always there and formed the backbone of the team with Mike Shaw and Lee Carr despite his sporadic availability.
