ACC President's Report 2004/2005

Season 2004/2005 did not start as well as it could have as the season's Committee was elected at the AGM on May 17th attended by sixteen club members. We left the meeting with a committee of six. Of the six, none had nominated for the positions of Secretary or Treasurer. We fumbled our way through the first few meetings and were strengthened by the addition of Adrian Hackett and as things started to fall into place, Alex Weir offered to take on the Secretary's position and Brendan Tribbeck managed to recruit his father – Murray – as treasurer. In addition to those mentioned, we also had myself, Mike Hamilton, Greg Oldfield and Cam Stirling. More on the committee further on.

Somehow or other, as we come out the other end of season 2004/2005, we can now look over a successful season which brought us three Grand Finalists and Premierships in both 9th and A Grade.

Our A Grade Premiership was our third in four years and our fourth consecutive Grand Final appearance in A Grade. This is a truly remarkable performance and has made us the envy of many clubs in the WASTCA. My personal thanks go to Mark Hullett for his efforts in overseeing all four Grand Final appearances and in particular this year where, without any absolute standout performances, that consistency, application and experience are the things that bring success. Here, I am talking across the season and while the individual exploits of Walton, Barber and Crowder at one time or another, it was the ability to do things with no great fuss that made the win all the more remarkable and somewhat of a surprise (to those outside the club) who wondered if Dad's army was up to it again.

Equally surprising, but for different reasons was the Premiership success of the 9th Grade team. Again, here was a team with no standouts (with the possible exception of Tim Miles with 38 wickets at 7.5 and the indefatigable Glenn Wright) who fought tooth and nail for every success and every run. This culture again flows from the captain Paul Slack-Smith. Unlike the A Grade, 9th Grade did their best to win a flag with the utmost fuss and while this was not visible always throughout the season, it was evident in the way 9th Grade limped to overhaul 128 in their Grand Final only to pass it in a blur as Adam Knowles bashed the winning six.

I hope I am not going into too much depth here and stealing those captains' thunder. It was in the end however a remarkable season as the club and in many cases the teams did not seem on the outside to deserve or be capable of such success.

To look back at committee level, we achieved what we could but not what we set out to. Meetings were akin to Forrest Gump's box of chocolates, and it wasn't just what you are going to get, it was who or how many as well. I will go through the committee again – thanks to:

Brendan Tribbeck - for standing in particularly early when my voice didn't work and for the work he did on fees. This should never be a problem but we have never been in such a good position on fees. Finally, for the auction night which was a great success and great fun.

Alex Weir – for taking on the Secretary's role when he joined the committee to help with Sponsorship.

Murray Tribbeck – got us out trouble when we had no treasurer. Made things easy to understand and we could never have done without him.

Mike Hamilton – hours and hours behind the bar. Mike gets his life back this year. This is a truly thankless task but thank you.



Adrian Hackett – club handyman, can and does do anything - all around the time of his first born too. Not a bad cricketer either but that should not be classed as Hack admiration.

Greg Oldfield – already does enough around the club and does so much for the club too. A major playing and background part to the three A Grade flags on the wall.

Cam Stirling – was a bad time for Cam to join as he had a lot on his plate personally. Cam has and had a lot of good ideas about how the club can go forward. We should listen to his ideas and take on his “we can do anything” attitude.

We started the year looking at a turf wicket but as it turns out with such a small committee, we again fell into the trap of looking after day to day things and not at the big picture. There are a lot of things the club needs to turn its mind and its hand to. We are the most successful A Grade team and probably club currently in the WASTCA. It is my opinion that we are missing a turf wicket and should exhaust all avenues before we make a decision on it one way or the other.

We also need to look at bigger issues like junior development and the renovation of Shirley Strickland Reserve. We must make inroads into the junior clubs in our area – like it or not we are on average an aging club and we need this influx to keep the club strong. The redevelopment of Shirley Strickland Reserve also needs to be taken on strongly and not just by the committee – these are club issues.

In recognition of this, Russell Kingdon drew a proposed club management structure to spread the workload across the club and we need to do this. It is our club but we also need to be focusing the intentions of our elected committee to greater issues affecting the long term viability of the club. Day to day issues must be taken on by club members.

We took the odd step this year of recruiting a new team led by Rex Evans and Mike (Cat) Maher. Rex brought over the Perth Postels (it always struck me that was spelt wrong but anyway ...) who formed our 7th XI – playing in Division 2 of the One Day competition. While the season was not all Rex and the boys would have liked on the field, they did have a good season and we look forward to seeing them next season with greater involvement around the club.

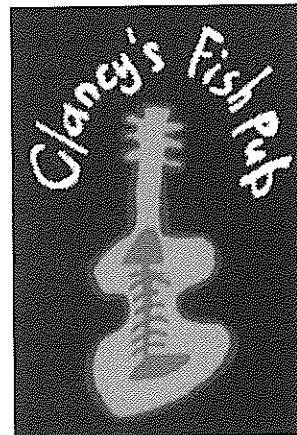
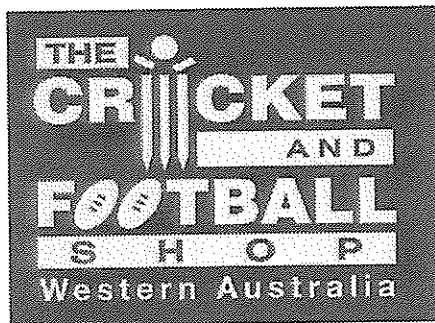

1st XI Captain's Report

Before the 2004/05 season started we had news thru that we'd lost FUZZ back to Perth after a bumper year, harvesting 900 runs at the top of the order. MONO had also been seduced by the lure of EATER'S one-day circus, while HIBBO wouldn't be back from the UK. These are 3 terrific fellas who'd had a big influence on our premiership the previous year. The HERB LIAISON brought good news that KENNERS would be back for another crack at his beloved ACC. Also, MAYSIE was prepared to sticky-tape his defective back and shoulder together for one last tilt at the flag which cruelly eluded him 3 years previous. The cake was iced when PAUL BARBER lobbed in from the ACC website with a Victorian District cricket background, a "don't miss a minute" free-scoring technique and a laid back attitude to match. Talk about made to order!

We got away to a decent start in round 1 by knocking over Ocean Ridge, with ALEX the pick of the attack after BARBS, KENNERS, OLDY and CROWDS all made 50. We were a bit careless against Bentley in a game which saw the A grade debut of LEE CARR, who went on to perform well as our 3rd seamer. AL, MAYSIE and CROWDS all had an all-round impact to get us over the line. Next was a visit to Doubleview-Innaloo-Yokine-Hamersley-Carine where BARBS made a brilliant 100 on an ordinary wicket, and CROWDS (61) provided a trademark recovery after we'd earlier lost 4 for 6. ALEX continued his great early form to take 5 for 60 in a tight win. We easily won the next two rain-reduced games to head the ladder at 5 and 0, with all of the top order getting amongst the runs and the seamers enjoying the juicy conditions. Round 6 was as predictable as it was annoying. Playing 2nd bottom Bed-Morley, who would later be relegated, we had an absolute shocker after a very average preparation. We spilt catches, leaked boundaries and batted without prudence in total contrast to how we have played over the last few years. The result was a 140 run shellacking for Christmas.

Our next fixture was with DooDah at Kent St, and with HOLTH and MAYSIE both missing the game ADRIAN HACKETT made an impressive A grade debut and showed plenty of promise in his 3 appearances. While bowling and fielding well to restrict Whitfords to 205, we never developed enough "pard-nerships" to really challenge the target. Encouraging signs came in the return from England indoor duties of WALT with 5 for 51 and KIP making a measured 56no against his old foe. Next was the first ever game on the corrugated new wicket at Swan Valley CC. After winning the toss and batting, a few of the boys looked sideways. About the 3rd ball of the day flew over KENNERS head from a good length which increased the sideways glances and soon enough we were 3 for 50 odd and missing OLDY (apparently in Tasmania?) and STEF. Character was required and McGyver CROWDER stepped up to play his best innings for the club, mixing smeared cover drives and cuts with deft tucks on the way to what should have been his maiden ton. His knock was sawn off (LBW) at 78 but with KENNERS (108) making light of the environment in a stand of 148, this pair guided us well past 200 which would always be too many. WALT again bowled a treat (4/40), MAYSIE took 3 for 12 and MULLET (pronounced MOO-LAY) made his ACC comeback with a tight spell and two wickets.

A funny thing happened over a few too many grogs at Swan Valley. A nameless tosser from the opposition told me we were a one man team (sorry WALT he didn't mean you) and that we wouldn't even make the 4 without KENNERS. Sadly and ironically, due to family illness, DEREK KENWAY didn't play for us again during the season.

We got the lollies in the next game against High Wycombe, making an unconvincing 179 on the best surface in the league. BARBS returned to form with a marvellous 76, while ALEX and MULLET put on 44 inestimable runs for the last wicket to keep us competitive. The seamers all bowled superbly before MAYSIE strung together eight



overs of dot balls in taking the under 12's figures of 5 for 8. Stump to stump at its finest.

Round 10 was against Subi and we played patiently and maturely in making 244 off 80 to sneak home by 17 runs after excellent stints from MULLET and WALTS. The last qualifying fixture turned into a bit of a farce after OLDY dropped a catch which my 2 year old daughter may well have caught and then threatened to engage club sponsor Bradford and Co to sue the umpires if "any of us gets killed on that wicket and can't play finals". Luckily none of us did although STEF and HOLTH both hung in there for a while and wore the shiners to prove it.

We drew Whitfords in the semi which really would have served as the better Grand Final. Plenty of needle ensued as we took first us of a wicket looking like a fresh laid tarmac – firm enough but not safe to drive on! All day was a struggle as evidenced by OLDY batting 66 overs for a priceless 53. KIP stepped up as he does in the company of DooDah while WALTS hit some long balls to give us the momentum with a brisk 48 to push the total to 218- all out in the last over. MULLET and WALTS ran thru their top order to have them reeling at 5/40 off 15 before they recovered to 5/130, and then ALEX killed them off in a magic spell after tea to take 3 for 10. All out for 160 and into another GF.

Subi-Marist had run us fairly close a few games earlier so we knew we were in for a tense contest. The first ice breaker came early on day one when STEF was listening to some music on MULLETS head phones. MULLET asks "What do you think of the iPod" to which PEPPER replies, totally straight faced, "Yeah they're not bad. Are they English?" None of us are sure to this day- Comic genius or iPod naïve. Seriously though, this game was marked by yet another GF Man of the Match performance from ANDY WALTON. The pressure was certainly on our attack defending a solid but gettable 236 when WALTS responded with the astonishing figures of 29 overs, 9 maidens, 9 wickets for just 60 runs "Awesome". He also ran out their best batsman with a direct hit, but had received terrific support from MULLET, ALEX and MAYSIE who all bowled in great areas to restrict runs and build pressure. The batting had been a tough struggle against good quality bowling. BARBS (64) and OLDY (43) got us away to a positive start (no KENNERS no Applecross hey!!), KIP made a solid 40 while CROWDS capped his season with another thoughtful dig of 57. Our simplistic goal is to bat our 80 overs and if you can do that in finals, you normally win. We did and we did!

I'll take this chance to thank all the guys who played over the course of the year. This team is a great bunch of blokes who I think make short work of anxiety by really enjoying each others company and thriving on a challenge.

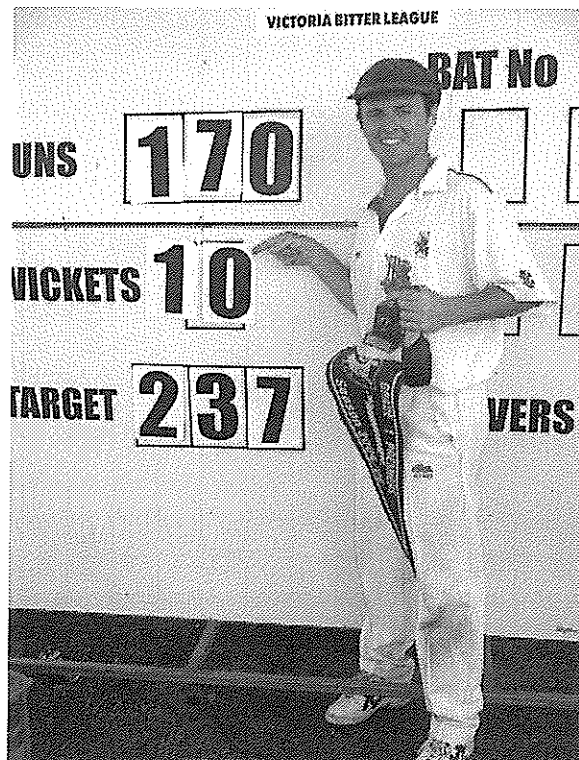

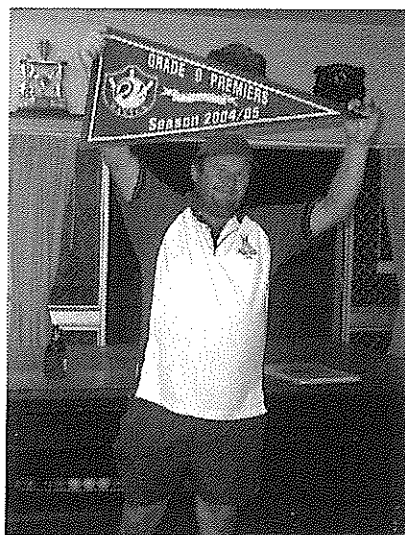
The season started on the wrong note with several people being unavailable for the first few games. This unfortunately became the trend for most of the season. First game against Ocean Ridge was a disappointing start with us going down by 1 run in a very average performance by both teams, with ACC scoring only about 140 in the first innings.

Subsequently 4 games into the season we were sitting at 3 losses and 1 win. But to the credit of some of the core players in the team, such as Damien O'Hara and Andrew Stampalia we started to make ground back up with wins in 2 out our next 3 games.

With a good second half of the season we ended up just missing out of the finals with a 6th position, 5 wins 5 losses and a draw.
